

Magistrate Hints 30 Days to Prison Term

SUMMERSIDE — Vincent Joseph Gallant, Summerside, appeared before Magistrate R.S. Hinton in Summerside police court yesterday morning on a charge laid Aug. 11, 1962, of throwing a stop sign through a windshield and causing an estimated \$100 damage. Gallant had pleaded guilty to this charge in police court Aug. 13.

At that time Magistrate Hinton gave Gallant time to pay for the damages incurred and withheld sentencing during the interval pending good behaviour. Defence counsel, George McDonald told the court that since the time accused had been on trial in Supreme Court and received a two-year term in Dorchester Penitentiary which afforded him no time to raise money.

Police Chief S.D.A. Wannamaker learned Gallant's action an "outright willful damage". Magistrate Hinton said "Gallant was given every leniency and our trust in him has been badly let down, and on that basis I think he should serve some time".

Magistrate Hinton imposed a sentence of 30 days to be served in Dorchester Penitentiary, the term to be consecutive to the two-year term imposed by the Supreme Court. The Magistrate told Gallant he "hoped" he could get some training there and come back a better boy".

Magistrate Hinton also took up by taking up his cross", he said. "By taking time to think about it, each one will realize why his cross is. One obvious one," he indicated, "is the cross of crucifying Christ in ridicule—pride in domination. If we Christians have good news, he continued, "we should be the first to love one another. It is not what we lose by coming together that counts".
