FRENCH AID.

All Desiring to Fight For the Boers to be Transported Free.

PARIS, Oct. 30.—While Great Britain is mobilizing its navy for use in case of official interference on the part of the French, an influential organization of Frenchmen has been formed for the purpose of equipping and transporting to Africa any Frenchmen who may volunteer to fight on the side of the Boers. At the head of this anti-English league are a number of Republic deputies. Among them is Alfred Mezieres, who represents one of the arrondissements of Moselle in the House Mezieres, who was born in 1862, fought through the Franco-Prussian war, and has served five terms as a deputy. His connection with the pro-Boer committee is significant because of the fact that he is one of the editors of the famous Review of Two Worlds and also of the Temps, one of the best known and most influential of the newspapers of Paris.

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

—Another Ontario Government commission is to be named to enquire into the administration and methods of the Treasury Department, and as to the assets and liabilities of the province. It is remarked by the Montreal Gazette that the new premier is probably making an effort to find that mythical Mosat-Hardy surplus.

—La Patrie challenged Sir Charles Tupper to repeat in Quebec the language he used elsewhere in regard to the Canadian contingent. Sir Charles has repeated it at Knowlton, and invited La Patrie to make note of and report it. The Conservative party, as the Montreal Gazette truly remarks, speaks with one voice when the country's duty is in question, and in this instance its voice will drown La Patrie's.

ESTERMED EXCHANGES.

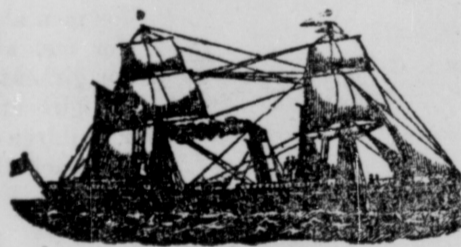

Toronto Mail: Britain will not profit by the war. She will not own or exploit the riches of the country. A great deal of nonsense has been talked about the prize Britain would gain by possessing the Transvaal. But the Imperial government and the taxpayers of the United Kingdom will not directly be a penny the richer when the Transvaal becomes a British possession.

There is more trouble between Japan and Russia. Three Japanese fishermen were murdered by Russian convicts at Korsu, Saghalien Island. They were clubbed to death and after having been robbed of all their money, the bodies were thrown over the precipice.

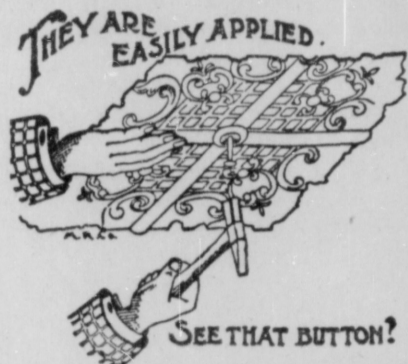

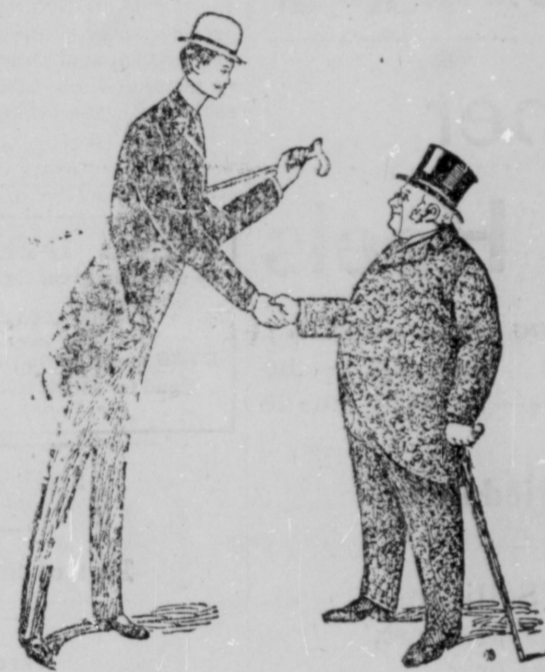
