The names appearing on the chit, along with their escorts, will be the recipients of the dinner, compliments of the Student Union and the Department of Student Services.

Members of the Department of Student Services and the Student Council will not be eligible for the lucky draw.

Student Council voted to give their support to "chit-chat", a joint venture of Student Services and the Student Union.

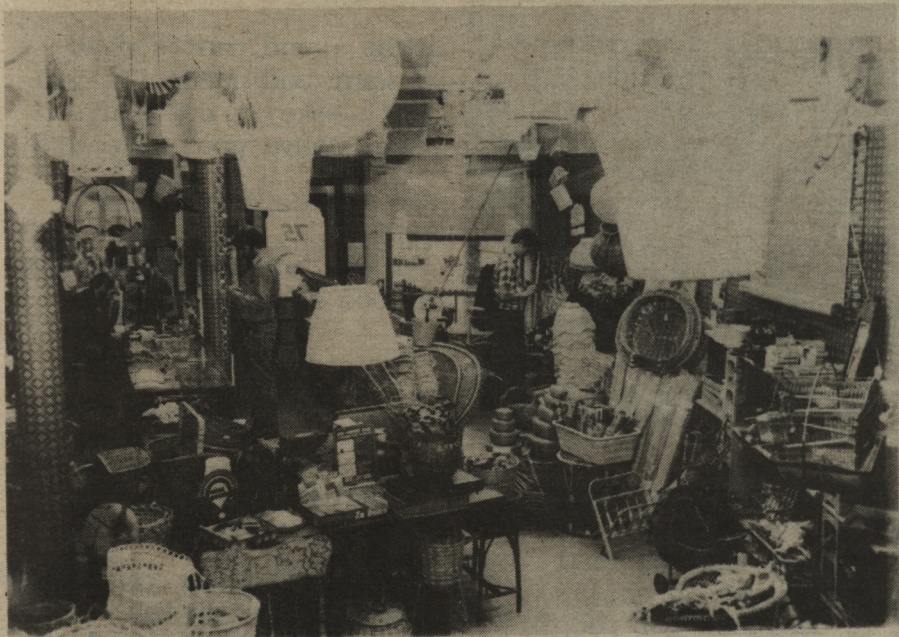
CIMN is now in a workable condition due to work done over the summer.
