trudictory it was explained by local officials. A considerable number of people who became unemployed in Upper Canada, have returned home at least temporarily. Moreover, since employment opportunities in other Provinces have decreased, very few people are leaving the Island seeking work.

One outlet for many labourers and construction workers has practically dried up - Labrador. Anywhere from 50 to 100 Islanders have been going to Labrador for the past number of years, but this summer very little construction work is being carried on in that area. It is apparent then that although fully as many people are employed on the Island as in other years, there are more people seeking work locally than usual.

GOOD CONSTRUCTION YEAR
Charlottetown is having a good year in construction, and a great deal of work is being carried on throughout the rural areas by both Dominion and Provincial Governments. The Provincial Government's program of road maintenance and highway construction, is providing employment for hundreds of people.

The Charlottetown office has just concluded a busy three weeks supplying pickers to the strawberry growers in the vicinity of Charlottetown. Upwards of 300 boys and girls in their early teens were recruited by the office, and sent out to the growers as needed. Usually the grower made arrangements to pick up his crew of pickers at some square or well-known landmark in the city. At one time during the rush, growers were picking up their crews at nine different points in Charlottetown. Officials of the Strawberry Growers' Association agree that it was a great season, with a record crop and a record price.

THOUGHTS FOR OUR TIME

BY HIS EMINENCE CARDINAL McGUIGAN

NO RANCOR, NO HATRED, NO REVENGE
One of the commandments of Christ which at times is particularly hard for us to observe is to forgive those who have injured us. Indeed, it is difficult enough to have given us cause for offense. Personalities so often conflict. But to be ready to forgive one who has offended us requires virtue which is sometimes truly heroic.

Yet there can be no doubt that such virtue is required of us by Christ. Recall the parable of the unforgiving servant. He had owed his master 10,000 talents (roughly \$15,000,000 in our money) but the master had pity on him and forgave him the debt. But one of his fellow servants owed the first servant 100 denarii (\$25) and the unforgiving servant threw him into a debtors' prison.

Naturally, when the master heard of this state of affairs, he was enraged and delivered him, too, to the torturers until he had paid off his enormous debt. "So also," says our Lord "shall my heavenly Father do to you, if you do not forgive your brother from your hearts."

But let us not go into detail on these points. The important point here is that, no matter how grievously we be offended we must harbor no rancor, no hatred, no desire for revenge against our offender. Indeed the very punishment which we may call upon the courts to mete out should have a salutary effect upon the soul of our offender, as Plato explained so well in one of his Dialogues.

Remember our Lord's touching parable, spoken after His Last Supper: "That they may be one, as Thou, Father, in Me, and I in Thee, that they may be one in Us."
