Three Centuries Behind Americans.

Several papers dealing with the Pennsylvania coal regions appear in *The Century*. Henry Edward Rood, writing of "A Polyglot Community," says: More than one-half the total number of immigrants into the United States are coming from Austria-Hungary, Italy, Poland and Russia. While official statistics are not available, yet careful investigation leads to the belief that perhaps 50 or 60 per cent of arrivals from the countries mentioned have had no regular occupation, while possibly 30 per cent may have been servants or laborers. Five years ago the Rev. Mr. Manjerio, himself an Italian, in company with the writer made a tour of observation through the Lehigh region of Pennsylvania, and stated that in his opinion the Italians working there were about three centuries behind Americans in their standards of living—that is, in their ideas as to food, clothing, shelter, wages, work and general intelligence. Since that time there has been no improvement in the class of immigrants arriving at our ports.

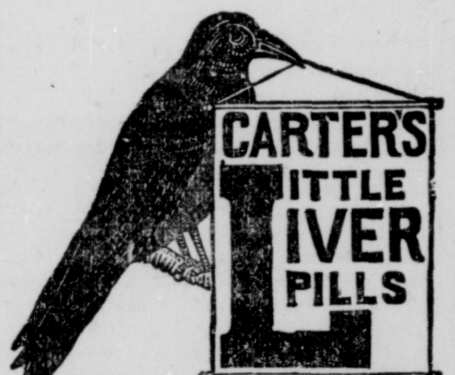
