BANNED LATER

Thalidomide subsequently was banned by the legislation in Parliament. The committee's principal recommendation was that the staff of the drug-examining center of the federal health department be increased.

It also recommended technical amendments to the department's regulations governing the testing and introduction of new drugs, and said a standing committee of practicing doctors and other experts should be appointed to keep regulations constantly under review.

The committee said the procedures of the health department were basically sound. However, it did not agree that thalidomide should be totally banned; it should be available for testing on animals. It also did not agree with the banning of lysergic acid diethylamide (LSD), used in treatment of mental patients.

OTTAWA (CP) — A committee of doctors has recommended more staff, tighter regulations and a watchdog committee to maintain a constant check on new drugs introduced in Canada.

Health Minister Monthie, tabling in the Commons a 37-page report of a special committee of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, said the government accepts the recommendations.

The committee, headed by Dr. F. S. Brien, professor of medicine at the University of Toronto, said it believes the report will be his hands any day now on the Restrictive Trade Practices Commission inquiry into drug prices.
