Hunters Jumping The Gun; Fishermen Are Successful

In addition, first-team members on the mid-season vote get \$500 and the runners-up \$250. Those who led the second-half voting also get \$500 and the runners-up \$250.

The final first team is the same as the mid-season one except for Mikita, who moved from the second-team berth to out Bellevue.

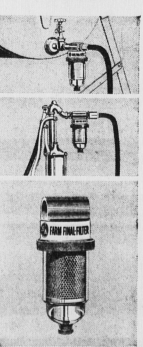
Changes on the second team include Bellevue for Mikita, and the absence of goaltender Johnny Bower of Toronto, defenceman Bob Baun of Toronto and leftwinger Dave Balon of Montreal. Hodge, who led the goaltending balloting in the second half, ousted Bower. Balon dropped from the tie he had held with Mahovlich in the first half and rookie Laperriere beat out Baun.

Other leaders in the second-half voting, and thus winners of \$500, are Plante, Horton, Mikita, Hall and Wharram and Howe. Wharram and Howe had an identical 98 points, but Wharram received nine first-place votes to Howe's eight and thus
