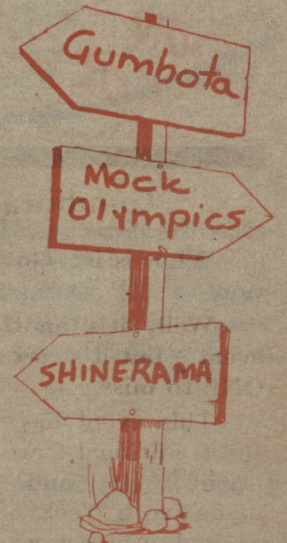
The Booster Committee is a small but hyperactive energetic group of people who have two main duties.
