education to a Province such as this; but beyond that he has no connected ideas whatever. He is very liberal with his censure, and indulges largely in safe generalities, but evidently he has not given the subject sufficient thought to have anything to say concerning it. He seems to labor under the impression that the object of public schools is to teach trades; and that, since agriculture is the most important trade, it should have the first place in the schools. But the object of our schools is not to teach trades; and Mr. Dewar should be aware of the fact. It is true that some knowledge of agricultural chemistry may be imparted in our public schools. Mr. Dewar is somewhat late, however, in calling the attention of the "proper authorities" to this. Their attention has been directed to it for some time, and the blame for any neglect in teaching agricultural chemistry does not rest with them. They have placed agricultural chemistry on the course of studies; they have prescribed a suitable text book, and they encourage its teaching by every means in their power. If they attempted to do more they would probably succeed in doing less. The chief reason why the teaching of agricultural chemistry is neglected in our schools is that the farmers themselves do not sufficiently recognize that it is a good thing. But, Mr. Editor, I shall with your permission return to this subject, and then I shall have something to say on what our schools should teach, and shall explain more fully than I have done why agricultural chemistry is neglected.

It was a pleasant sight which greeted the view of the writer as he entered the New Glasgow Road schoolhouse on the night of the 24th December. Upon seats, raised one above another, sat the pupils of the school—some seventy in number—whose sunny faces were all turned toward "the generous Christmas tree," which stood in the opposite corner. It was a good tree, brilliantly lighted with wax candles, and its boughs laden with a vast number of beautiful and useful presents for the children. A School Exhibition, consisting of singing, readings and recitations, was given by the pupils. At the close of the entertainment it was announced that Santa Claus would shortly make his appearance and distribute the presents. All eyes were immediately fixed upon the door. In a few minutes he appeared dressed in a very fantastic costume. Those of us who were beginning to think that St. Nicholas is growing old and feeble were agreeably disappointed. On this occasion he was particularly frisky; and the way in which he sent the presents up to the children occasioned considerable anxiety among his assistants for the safety of the breakable articles. A pleasant feature in the distribution of presents was that the children who had least prospect of receiving presents were the ones who received the greatest number—a fact which speaks well for the kind-heartedness of the people. The teacher of the school, Mr. J. M. Campbell, received from his pupils a beautiful gift—a silent and yet very expressive indication of the kindly feeling existing between pupils and teacher.

At length all was over, Santa withdrew happy in the possession of an elegant whip which was presented to him in order that he might the more easily make up lost time. The little ones were taken in charge by their parents, and bundled off home to dream it all over again.

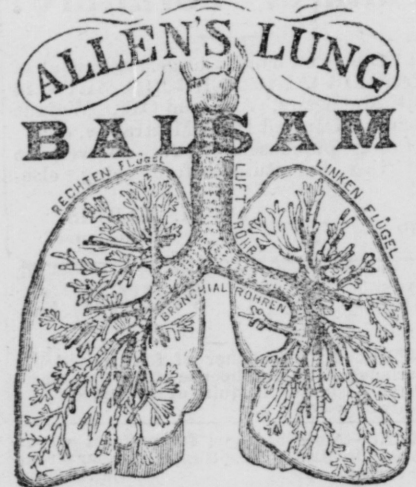
