His GRACE, the Archbishop of Halifax, who was taken suddenly ill on Saturday last, is reported better. He intends going to the Southern States for the benefit of his health.

LUKE STEWART & Co.'s Baltimore circular reports that grain freights at that port last week were active, with few vessels engaged. Advanced rates are looked for as few vessels are bound for Baltimore.

The Inspector of Finance, T. D. Tims, Esq., visited the Audit office and Savings Bank a few days ago, and found both those offices in a highly satisfactory condition under their new management.

The bark "Isobel," McLure, Master, cleared from Montague Bridge on the 26th for Demacera, with an assorted cargo of coal, hay, white and black oats, horses, sheep, and 25,000 feet of boards.

APPLE SHIPMENTS.—Last week over eighteen thousand barrels were shipped from Montreal—the largest shipment ever made from that port. It is said that over seven thousand barrels are to be shipped from Kings Co., N. S.
