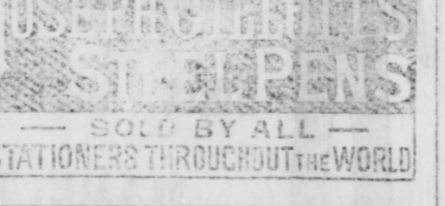

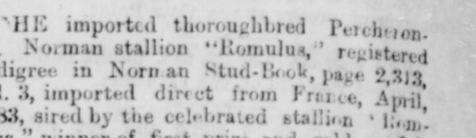

Stallion Romulus.



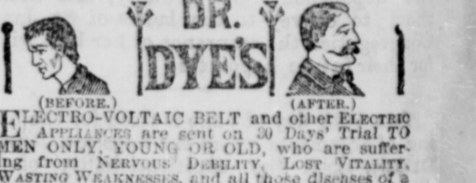
