News In Brief

WINDSOR, Ont., Feb. 12 (CP)—A strike at the Ford of Canada plant will start at 10 P. M. E. S. T. Sunday, George Burt, Canadian Director of the United Automobile Workers (C.I.O.), said tonight.

OTTAWA, Feb. 12 (CP)—Canada will observe the same period of official mourning as the United Kingdom — to Saturday, May 31 — officials said today.

RIVIERE-DU-LOUP, Que., Feb. 12 (CP)—Fifty-mile per hour gusts of wind lashed this district early this morning, disrupting electric services, stalling traffic, and piling up snow drifts seven to eight feet high.

LONDON, Feb. 12 (Reuters)—British brewers last year exported more than 12,500,000 gallons of beer, the highest figure for 15 years. Britain's 443 breweries produced in all 893,140,000 gallons.

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Feb. 12 (AP)—United States army troops stationed in Alaska have started large scale winter manoeuvres designed to test the capabilities and limitations of ground forces under severe sub-Arctic conditions. The exercise, dubbed "Operation White Sox", will centre along the Anchorage-Fairbanks highway.

OTTAWA, Feb. 12 (CP)—Meat stockpiles in Canada are on the upswing. The Bureau of Statistics reported today that stocks of all meats on Feb. 11 totalled 77,198,000 pounds, an increase of almost 11,000,000 pounds from 66,547,000 on Jan. 1 and up more than 14,000,000 pounds from 62,919,000 on Feb. 1 a year ago.

COBALT, Ont., Feb. 12 (CP)—Investigations begun shortly after Christmas have thrown no light on the disappearance Dec. 22 of a lumber camp worker, his wife and a 18-month-old adopted son.

Cadillac, Kegawags, Maniwaki, Belletre and Ville-Marie, all Quebec communities east of here, and in Callander, Ont., have failed to find any trace of the couple or their child.

One possible solution of the mystery has been suggested. Relatives fear that the family may have been in a car which disappeared through the ice of Lake Timiskaming Jan. 12. They fear the Gaudets may have driven across the ice from Halleyburg, Ont., to Belletre, Que., to visit Gaudet's parents.
