Chicago was comparatively quiet Sunday, a lull in the biggest Independence Day weekend in its history. But the final details were being put to the 12-hour visit that starts at noon A.D.T. today when the Queen arrives on the Lake Michigan waterfront.

Officials said Sunday night they expect 1,500,000 persons will see her. Few Chicagoans appeared to think it paradoxical to celebrate good riddance to British monarchy July 4 and then turn about Monday to put on what will be the greatest show of the Queen's 45-day tour.
