to say that the present Personnel Board is the best one we have had in numerous years.

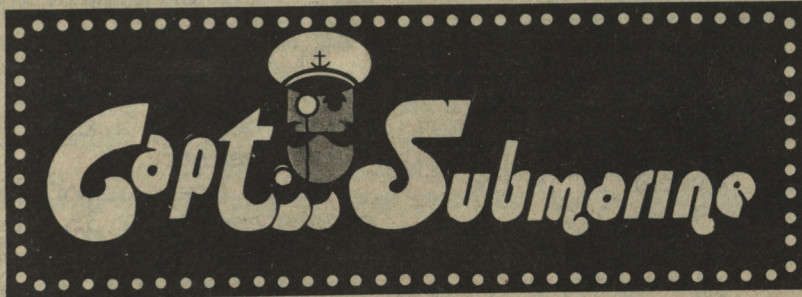
If people feel they can do a better job they are welcome to try. Positions will be open next spring.
