THE RUTLAND MACDONALD ESTATE.—The Halifax Herald says: Eneas Macdonald, barrister, of Charlottetown, P. E. Island, has been engaged by Mrs. Campbell of that city to look into the estates appertaining to the Macdonald-Rutland family in Scotland. Mr. Macdonald, by letter, September 5th, has signified his intention to retain a Scotch law firm to sift the matter to the bottom. This step has been made through the publication in the Mail of the history of the Nova Scotian branch of this once famous family.

LAUNCH.—The Messrs Richards, of Ebeford launched a new 420 ton vessel on Wednesday morning, in the presence of a large crowd of people. Miss Palmer of Charlottetown broke a bottle of wine over her bow and christened the hull "Jester." A sad accident happened during the launch. Mr. Albert Williams was struck by a rope and thrown upon a pile of anchors, while the vessel was being towed to the wharf and received severe injuries—two ribs being broken. Dr. Long of Tyne Valley was called and attended the injured man, and he is now doing as well as could be expected.—Guar.

SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER.

The Cholera. MONTREAL, Sept. 9.

The sensational announcement in a morning paper that cholera had appeared in the St. Lawrence on the steamer Wandanham is false.

SANDY HOOK, N. Y., Sept. 9. The steamer Rugia hoisted the yellow flag again yesterday.

HAVRE, Sept. 9. Nineteen new cases of cholera appeared in this city on Wednesday and 11 deaths.

BERLIN, Sept. 9. A new case of cholera was reported here to-day. The Emperor has countermanded orders for the army manoeuvres at Berlin owing to the prevalence of cholera.

ST. PETERSBURG, Sept. 9. There were 119 new cases of cholera yesterday and 39 deaths.

Good Advice—Schooner Wrecked. OTTAWA, Sept. 9.

The Journal of this city calls attention to the probability that the American Government will abolish the privilege of transit in bond, and advises Canadian importers to arrange for the import of their goods through Canadian ports only, and thus thwart any effort to embarrass our import trade.

The Department of Marine has received information from Cape Race that on Tuesday morning last the New Brunswick schr. M. A. Nutten was wrecked at Chance Cove Head, Cape Race.

Racing at Halifax. HALIFAX, Sept. 9.

The race for the two year olds yesterday was won by Bishop, owned by J. C. Mahon, Truro. Best time 2:47 1/2, breaking the maritime record. Geo Buchanan second, Sir Richard, third.

The three year old race was taken by Brazilian, Francis P. second, and Mary L. third.

Sullivan's Nose. NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 9.

Sullivan's face is swollen and his lips disfigured and distorted. His nose was not broken, but it is terribly bruised and is cut from the bridge down the centre and on the left side.

The Bicycle Record. SPRINGFIELD, Sept. 9.

Zimmerman yesterday reduced the bicycle records for three, four and five miles, making the distances respectively in 7 mins. 18 4/5 sec., 9 min. 41 sec., and 12 min. 2 3/5 sec.

Foul Murder. GREENFIELD, Mass., Sept. 9.

Abigail Rogers, aged 58, was found yesterday murdered in her house on a lonely road. It is not known who did the murderous deed.

Successful Launch. GLASGOW, Sept. 9.

Cuparider Campaigns the largest steamer in the world was successfully launched here yesterday.
