

# Tigers Defeat Nats 3-2; Pirates Upset Giants 5-4

Eddie Yost's lead-off home run in the first inning provided Detroit with the margin of victory Wednesday in a 3-2 decision over Washington Senators.

The tall righthander needed some strong relief help in the eighth inning when the Senators scored both their runs. Bunning had yielded only one hit—a looping single to right field by Ken Aspromonte in the second inning—until he ran into trouble in the eighth.

A walk to Aspromonte started it. Jim Lemon's pinch single kept the rally alive and Bunning loaded the bases on a walk to Bob Allison.

Russ Kemmerer was the loser, giving up Yost's home run and two other runs in the sixth. Al Kaline doubled home one of the sixth inning runs and Kemmerer forced the other across with a bases loaded balk.

The 38th homer for the Bronx-born Colavito gave him the major league lead in that department. Elston Howard drove in three Yankees runs with a home run and a double off Cleveland starter Gary Bell. Jim Perry (10-5) came in with two out in the eighth inning and picked up the win. Duren (2-6) took the loss.

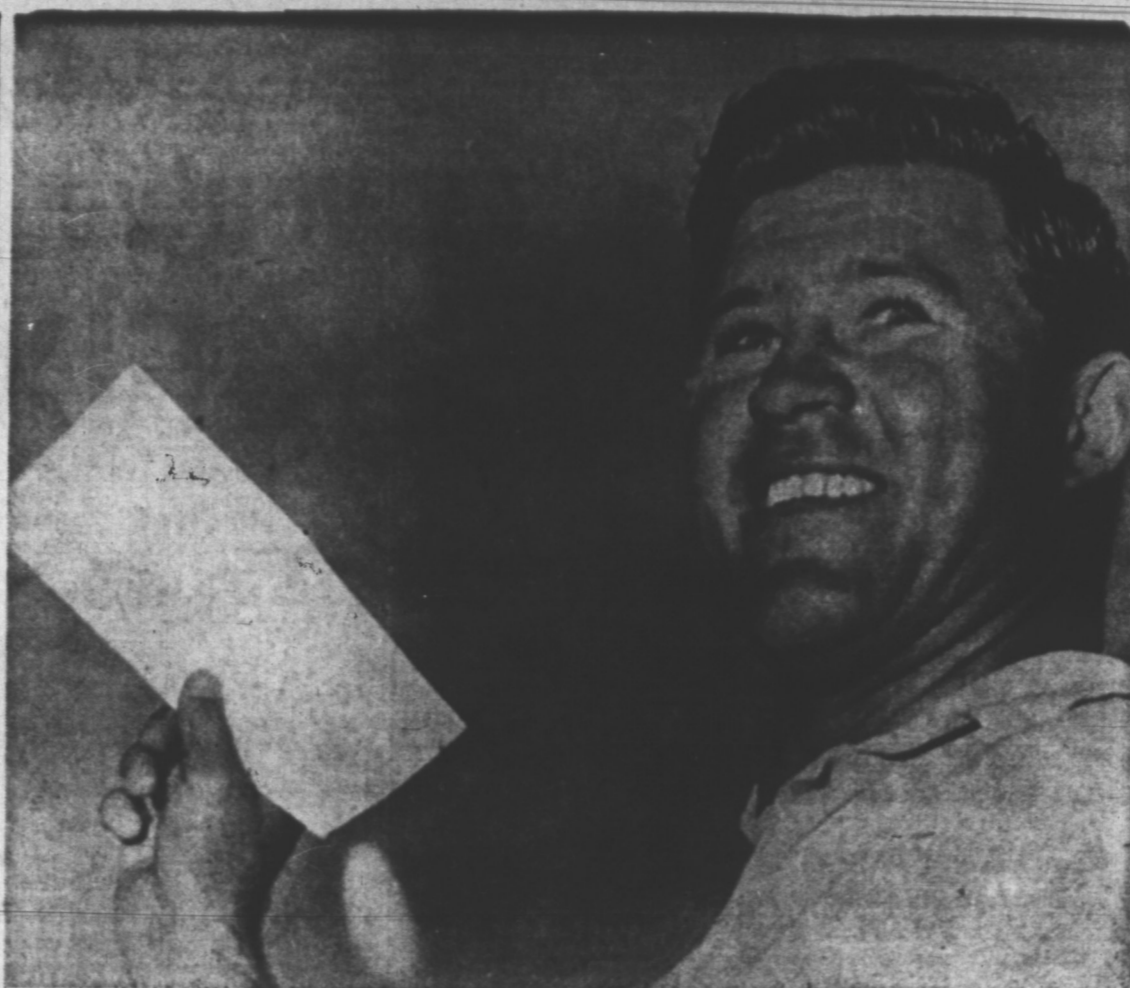
