KILLED.—A horse belonging to Mr. Robert Taylor, truckman, while wandering on the Railway track last night was struck by the express train which arrived at nine o'clock. The unfortunate animal died of the effects, shortly after the accident. At Boucherville, Quebec, last Saturday, a young farmer named Deeragon arose early in the morning and walked into the river and held his head under the water until he was drowned. He was only married eight days. No cause is assigned for the suicide. A MEDAL is to be given to all who took a military part in the Egyptian war by the English authorities. There will be a Sphinx on the reverse of the medal, with the date 1882 and the word Egypt. The Queen's seal will be on the obverse, as was the case with the Ashantee medal. TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

Arabi's Special Rights. The Army of Occupation. BAKER PACHA'S LIFT. Special to the Examiner.

ALEXANDRIA, Oct. 23. The counsel for Arabi's defenses have been able to gain some important points favorable to their client. Witnesses for Arabi will be permitted to appear before the tribunal, and measures will be taken to secure their attendance from abroad. Arabi's counsel have been granted the right of final reply. The Khedive is providing for the payment by the Egyptian Government of the cost of the British Army of occupation. The Khedive has made Baker Pacha General of Division. The appointment is the highest in the gift of the Khedive, and is looked upon as a distinguishing mark of favor towards the English Colonel.

Organizing Reform Clubs. A Revolutionary Organization. Special to the Examiner.

LONDON, Oct. 23. An important Reform Club was organized at Newcastle, England, for the purpose of bringing pressure to bear on the Government during the coming session. The conference has concluded its sitting, and has passed strong resolutions urging the Government to take in hand the immediate reformation of the English Land Laws, in order to bring them into consonance with modern views and thus save, in some measure, the land to the people of England. The organization is the outcome of the increasing popularity of Mr. Cowan, a well known revolutionary leader, and one of the best orators in the House of Commons. The Annual Congress of the Commonwealth Revolutionary Organization opened in London to-day. There was a very large attendance of American and of European delegates.

REVOKING PROCLAMATIONS. DUBLIN, Oct. 23. The Lord Lieutenant of Ireland has revoked the proclamation of Loughrea, and of the neighboring districts. He speaks in a most encouraging way of the improved condition of the country.

RIOTS IN LYONS. A REVIVED TREATY A KING SHOT AT. Special to the Examiner.

PARIS, Oct. 23. Riotous demonstrations have taken place at Lyons against the Municipality, in consequence of the suppression of an opera. The Gendarmes cleared the street. The French Government has revived the treaty with the Bey of Tunis. France undertakes to redeem many of her old promises, and the conditions of the treaty are now looked upon with much satisfaction. News has been received here that a woman shot twice at King Milan while he was attending service in the Cathedral at Belgrade. The King was unhurt. The Criterion Stakes—Fires at St. Petersburg—Destroyed by a Cyclone.

LONDON, Oct. 23. Maenath won the Criterion stakes at Newmarket to-day. Fires continue in all directions around St. Petersburg. To-day the lumber yards are all on fire. There is no doubt that the simultaneous firing is the work of incendiaries. News received from Manila report that the town has been nearly destroyed by a terrible cyclone which visited the Philippine Islands.

MONTEAL, Oct. 24. L. H. Davies, Q. C., arrived at Ottawa yesterday to represent respondents at the exchequer appeal. The items re Mousseau's election, forwarded to the press last evening were not correct.

GENERAL CABLE NEWS. LONDON, Oct. 22. The News says this morning it understands that Mr. Gladstone, on the reassembling of Parliament, will move that a select committee be appointed to enquire into the circumstances under which Mr. E. Dwyer Gray was imprisoned. The peculiar management of the Long-fellow Memorial begins to elicit remark, partly because so many obscure names appear on the published lists. It is now stated that no application has yet been made to the Dean for permission to erect the bust in the Abbey. The Dean, it is believed, will readily assent, but protests are heard against admitting foreigners. At Hanley, yesterday, many members of the Salvation Army were injured, most of them seriously, by the falling of a floor. RED HOUSE OBSERVATORY, PHELPS, N. Y., Oct. 22. Prof. Brooks, this morning, verified the discovery made by him yesterday of a fragmentary comet, eight degrees east of the great comet. It was smaller, this morning and resembles in form the celebrated portion detached from the Bielar comet. It is near the path of the great comet, and Prof. Brooks believes it to be identical with the envelope thrown off several days ago.

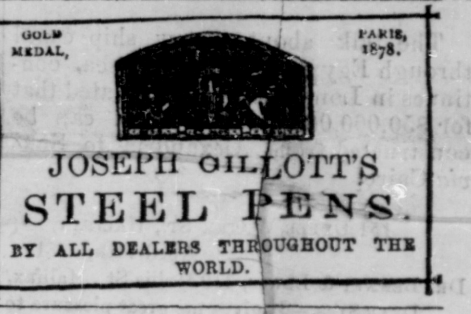

IN THE SUPREME COURT.

In the matter of An Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the forty-fifth year of Her present Majesty's reign, Chapter 23, intitled, "An Act respecting Insolvent Banks, Insurance Companies, Loan Companies, Building Societies, and Trading Corporations, and of the President, Directors, and Company of the Bank of Prince Edward Island, an Insolvent Banking Company."

UPON the application of the Liquidators of the above-named Banking Company, and upon reading the affidavit of Lemuel Cambridge Owen, Charles Colson Gardiner, and David C.
