WORLD SERIES NOTES

NEW YORK (AP)—While Don Larsen was outside standing before almost as many klieg lights as a Hollywood star, New York Yankees manager Casey Stengel sat in his cubicle off to the side of the dressing room following the big righthander's no-hit, 2-0 perfect game over the Brooklyn Dodgers. Case just kept shaking his head in bewilderment.

Stengel hasn't decided who will pitch today and he won't until at least game time. "First I want to see how Bob Turley and Johnny Kucks warm up," he said.

The Brooks used their "bou-dreau shift" against Mickey Mantle on the switcher's first two trips to the plate. They might just as well have all sat down for all the good it did them the second time when he belted his home run. They talk about the Ebbefts Field bandbox - Mickey's homer was straight down the right field line. He got a single on the same kind of hit in Flatbush on Friday.

While you can't beat a no-hitter, the score might very well have been 1-0 if Sandy Amoros had fielded Hank Bauer's single cleanly in the sixth. Andy Carey, one second base, had not even got to third when Sandy picked up the ball, but he bobbed it momentarily and Carey got home. The consensus was that Carey was a dead duck if Sandy had made the play.

The Dodger batters complained of the shadows in the stadium, but by the fifth inning, the entire area from the pitcher's box to the plate was shaded, so that was one argument they couldn't use. Maglie threw 30 pitches in the first three innings and 22 of them were strikes.

Hank Bauer's vest - pocket analysis of Maglie: "If you can make 54 pitch the ball up above the ground, you have a chance to hit him. His high curve isn't anywhere high that you can get your bat on" . . . As for Larsen, the hero of the hour, before the game he was saying to a group of reporters just as casually as if he turned out, he was: "If I have any luck, I'll do all right."

Argos Down Tiger-Cats As Halfback Runs Wrong Way

Halfback Tex Robinson of the Hamilton Tiger-Cats ran 70 yards the wrong way without knowing it and gave Toronto Argonauts two points on a safety touch as the Tics defeated the Argos 34-29 Monday in a Big Four football game in Toronto.

The former Cleveland Browns halfback picked up a fumble at the Toronto 49-yard line and thought he was on his way to the Toronto goal line and a touchdown. The wrong-way run came in the third quarter with the Tiger-Cats ahead 34-7 but it sparked the Argos who went on to score three touchdowns and two converts to draw within five points of tying the score.

Other Thanksgiving holiday action saw the league-leading Montreal Alouettes dump Ottawa Rough Riders 49-9 Montreal after spotting the Riders to a touchdown and a single in the opening quarter.

In the WFL, halfback Ken Carpenter scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns to give Saskatchewan Roughriders a 26-14 victory over Winnipeg Blue Bombers at Regina.

DOUBLE VICTORY
The Tiger-Cats' win, coming on top of their 42-6 victory Saturday, gave them a sweep of their home-and-home holiday weekend doubleheader over the Argos. The Tics moved into sole possession of second place, six points behind Montreal, as Ottawa dropped into the third spot.

The latest Argos loss was their fourth straight and left them in last place, two points behind Ottawa.

Hamilton scored all their points in the first half, counting three touchdowns, two converts and a single in the first quarter and two touchdowns and a convert in the second quarter.

Tony Curcio, Hamilton's new quarterback from Chicago Cardinals, threw passes for three of Hamilton's five touchdowns. Halfback Ralph Goldston, a new import from Philadelphia Eagles, and hard-hitting Cookie Gilchrist each scored two touchdowns and end Paul Dekker got the other. Bill Bewley, who converted all touchdowns, booted a 22-yard field goal in the third quarter, and half through the final quarter another touchdown pass by Etcheverry to O'Quinn was enough to wrap up Montreal's eighth win in 10 games.

Don St. John scored Ottawa's lone touchdown in the opening quarter. It was converted by Bud Korchak, and the Riders counted on singles booted by Avatus Stone.

The Riders lost halfback Karl Hilsinger in the second quarter. It was announced he had suffered a compound fracture of the left leg.

Don Larsen's Wife Wants His World Series Money Held Up

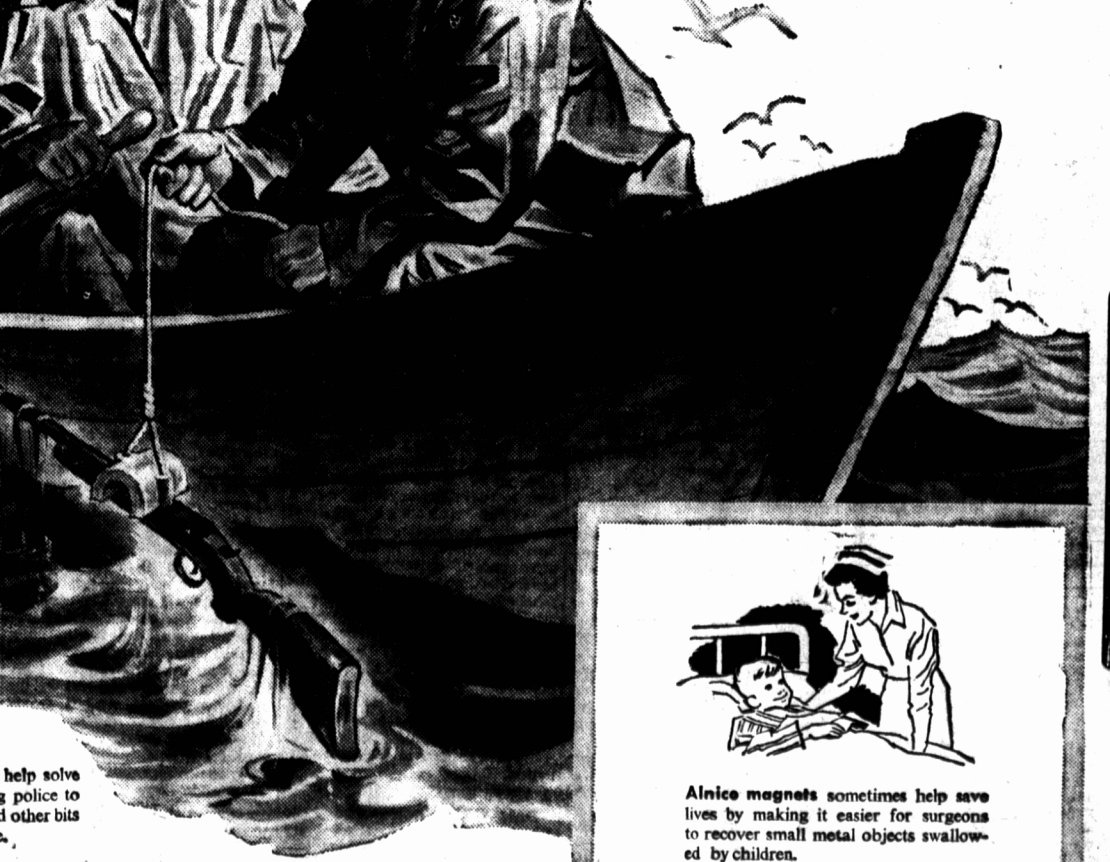
NEW YORK (AP)—Donald James Larsen—the Don Larsen who pitched a perfect game Monday in leading New York Yankees to victory over the Brooklyn Dodgers in the world series—was named in a Bronx Supreme Court action by his estranged wife, who claims he owes her back support payments and wants his world series money held up.

The action involving Larsen was brought by Vivian A. Larsen who claims the pitcher owes her \$420 in back support payments.

Mrs. Larsen obtained a show cause order from Supreme Court Justice Samuel H. Hofstadter. It is returnable Oct. 15.

The court order requires Larsen, the New York Yankees Baseball Club and Ford Frick, commissioner of baseball, to show cause why Larsen's world series money should not be withheld from him and set aside for support payments.

In papers filed by Mrs. Larsen, she said she and the pitcher were married April 23, 1955, and that he deserted her a few months later. She said he is required by a court order signed by Supreme Court Justice Henry C. Greenberg on July 16, 1956, to pay her \$60 weekly support.
