



ALTHOUGH LESS than 900 square feet in floor area, this bungalow provides three-room accommodation, reason-able living space and a carport. The design is by J. L. Blatherwick, Toronto architect.

Two entrances, one from the carport, give convenient access to the kitchen and dining room. Steps lead to the basement from the entrance hall. Ample closet space is available in all bedrooms which are built to one side of the house around centrally located bath.

The floor area is 864 square feet and the exterior dimensions 36 feet by 24 feet, the carport adding 12 feet to the frontage. Working drawings for this house, known as Design 2368, are available from Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation at minimum cost.

FIRST AID FOR THE HOME

DULL CONCRETE FLOOR QUESTION: The colored concrete floor in our basement looks bright when damp after washing; when dry, it's dull. Is there any way to brighten it without painting?

ANSWER: If the concrete isn't powdery, one or two applications of a good quality paint wax should improve the appearance. A thorough buffing of each coat will give the floor a lustrous finish. Dull concrete should receive a course of soaking with a liquid cement hardener, available at masonry supplies dealers. After the hardener has thoroughly dried, apply the wax.

REMOVING WAAX AND POLISH QUESTION: Our mahogany furniture is nearly 20 years old and has layers and layers of wax and furniture polish on it. It is dirty and much darker than it should be. Washing hasn't helped. What can we do to remove the wax and polish?

ANSWER: A nationally-known manufacturer of polishes and waxes makes a combination cleaning and polishing compound that works very satisfactorily. It is available in housewares and hardware stores, as well as at paint dealers.

BRASS CARE QUESTION: I have a solid brass coffee table, from India. I want to polish and coat it so that it won't tarnish.

ANSWER: Excellent brass polishes are now widely available; follow label directions carefully. To remove any corroded spots rub with sand and hot vinegar or rust-removing preparations available at some hardware stores. For protective coating, wipe with denatured alcohol to remove any trace of grease on the surface (work with gloves on to prevent deposit of oil from finger tips); then spray on special clear lacquer, available for just a few pennies.

CLEANING POROUS BRICK QUESTION: How can I clean a fireplace made of a soft type of red brick? When scrubbed the suds turn pink. It is almost impossible to rinse it clean. Even after cleaning it to dull and dry in appearance.

ANSWER: A chemical cleaning preparation for porous stone and stone-like surfaces is now available at large masonry supplies dealers. Follow label directions carefully. Or scrub with powdered pumice and water. When clean and dry, the exterior of the brick can be enriched (although slightly darkened) by applying a soaking coat of oil. Try this on an inconspicuous "test" brick first, to see how you like the effect.

CREOSOTE IN CHIMNEY QUESTION: In our six-room, 2-story house, we are satisfied with the stove, but we have creosote

coming through the upstairs chimney and also downstairs. Is there any way to check this without going to the expense of building a new chimney?

ANSWER: The only way to get rid of creosote is to rebuild the upper part of the chimney, including a fire-day flue lining. If the chimney flue is large enough, creosote formation can be prevented by inserting a length of porcelain enameled pipe from the flue connection of the stove to the chimney top. The space between the pipe and chimney masonry should be closed at the top with a slab of concrete in some other way.

STREAKS ON FIREPLACE QUESTION: What is the best way to clean fireplace brick left streaked with plaster by the builder? How is concrete hearthstone cleaned?

ANSWER: Apply water to the plaster streaks to soften the plaster, then scrape off with a piece of board or wide-blade knife. To clean the concrete hearthstone, scrub with a strong solution of trisodium phosphate, using about a cupful in a gallon of hot water, rinsing thoroughly afterwards with clear water.

SLUW HOT WATER QUESTION: Recently our hot water throughout the house seems to run very slow. What is the cause. Can this be remedied?

ANSWER: The inside of the heating coil and the horizontal piping between the coil and tank may be clogged with scale or rust or both. Recommend having a competent plumbing contractor inspect and replace, if necessary. Installing a magnetic rod is a slow inhibitor of scale formation in this condition in future.

COLD CEMENT FLOOR QUESTION: The cabinet in a small building I rent out suffers from cold feet all winter because of the cement floor on which are rubber mats. What would be practical and inexpensive way of adding flooring or covering the rubber mats? There is enough space for floor to be raised and

still have doors clear, no basement. Want to remedy before next winter.

ANSWER: Covering the floor with self-insulating sheets, then carpeting over the entire floor, will make floor warmer. A more permanent method would be to lay down a wood flooring over the insulation. Outside-The-Law Try Made To Prevent Thalidomide Sale

OTTAWA (CP)—The head of the federal Food and Drug Directorate stepped outside the law last spring to help drug manufacturers keep out of the baby-deforming drug thalidomide out of the hands of the public.

Dr. C.A. Morrell said here in an interview that at the request of one manufacturer of the sedative drug he wrote a letter threatening prosecutions if thalidomide was not removed from the market.

"I don't know under what circumstances such prosecutions could have been made," he said when asked whether there was legal provision for such prosecutions.

"I heard from one company by phone that they were having difficulty getting back onto the stocks that were out, but some to whom it was supplied wanted to keep them. They asked for help."

"That day I wrote the two manufacturing companies and advised them that the acceptance of thalidomide had been withdrawn from the market. It would be allowed and that, if it was longer sales were being made, thalidomide would be subject to seizure and prosecutions would follow."

SHOWED TO DRUGGISTS
"I understand the letter was used to show druggists to convince them to return stocks."

Dr. Morrell's sale was the climax of a behind-the-scenes drama, which dates back to September, 1960, when W. S. Merrell Company of Weston, Ont., applied to market thalidomide, which had been developed by a West German drug company.

The company had conducted a lengthy clinical report on the drug which included clinical data on 3,000 persons, among them 84 pregnant women.

Dr. Morrell said there was nothing in the report to raise fears of malformations. All the children of the women were described as normal.

His first hint of trouble with thalidomide came last December—the drug went on the market.

Brain Tension Mood No Longer Evident

While nothing basic has changed in the Berlin dispute, the mood of tension that pervaded the United States after the Berlin wall went up last August has disappeared this summer.

A symptom: The fallout shelter craze that saw thousands of Americans digging into their yards is as outmoded as the hula hoop craze of 1958.

Without fuss, the House of Representatives this week voted to throw out President Kennedy's request for \$568,725,000 to start a big new shelter program.

It brought only mild criticism. At the same time 154,000 reserve troops are quietly getting ready to go back into civvies.

Some of the United States' allies on the other side of the Atlantic, meanwhile, are showing concern over what they regard as a shift in American policy on the defence of Western Europe.

Politicians and newspapers have expressed apprehension over the coming retreat of Gen. Lauris Norstad as NATO supreme commander in Europe and the selection of Gen. Lyman Lemnitzer, also an American, to replace him.

Succeeding Lemnitzer as chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff is Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, who has argued that U.S. atomic retaliatory power should not be used except to assure national survival.
