Death of Mr. Hanford

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor received telegraphic advice this forenoon, of the death, at St. John, last night, of Thomas Hanford, Esq., father of Mrs. Carvell, in his seventy-eighth year.

Our Market in England.

Professor Robertson Talks to the Farmers.

Following is a summary of the address of Prof. Robertson on the "Possibilities of Selling Canadian Farm Products at a Profit in the English Market," delivered before the Ontario Farmers' Central Institute. He said: "The farmers of Ontario and of Canada stand head and shoulders above the working farmers in any other country in the world in point of intelligence."

A THREE FOLD COMPETITION existed in most markets. (1) A competition between buyers which tended to raise the prices. (2) A competition between sellers for a purchaser, which tended to reduce prices, and (3) competition between commodities and qualities of the same commodity for the preference of the buyer.

THE ENGLISH MARKET for our food products seems to meet all the requirements. It has been made easy of access by the enlarged and improved carrying facilities from railways and steamships.

Of live cattle, Great Britain imported in year ending Dec. 31, 1891, animals to the number of 507,407, valued at \$41,763,659. Of these Canada sent 108,289 animals, valued at \$8,623,202.

Of beef Great Britain imported in the year ending December, 1891, to the value of \$21,386,610. During the year ending June 30, 1891, Canada furnished to Great Britain only \$740 worth.

Of these, in 1891 there were imported into Great Britain 344,544. Of that number, Canada sent 49,731. Some experiments in the shipment of lambs to the English market were made and reported upon by Prof. Shaw, whose excellent reputation is known throughout all Ontario.

Of mutton Great Britain imported in 1891 to the value of \$15,972,444. Last year Canada sent to the value of \$8,066. The market is large, and there may be room for supply from Canadian sheep farms, which as yet are all too few and small.

Of the total value of the bacon, ham and pork imported into Great Britain for the year ending December 31, 1891, was \$48,868,234. For the year ending June, 1891, Canada sent 7,530,079 pounds, valued at \$626,037, or about 1 1/2 per cent. of England's importation.

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There is a large and growing trade in England in the article of condensed milk. The value of what was imported into England in the year 1891 was \$4,124,745.

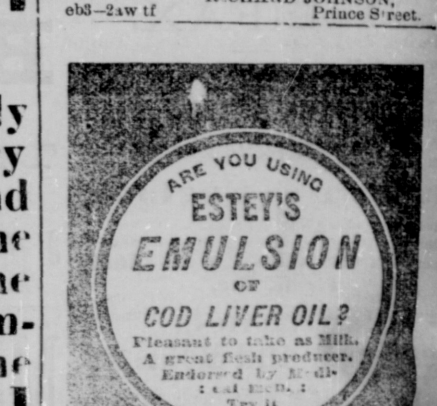
