TOMCAT WORTH WEIGHT IN GOLD

LONDON (CP)—It turns out that Michael, the marmalade cat whose mistress won a cat-fod contest, is worth more than his weight in gold.

First place in the contest went to Miss Rose Harrington, 61, of Enfield, Middlesex. The prize was the cash value of the cat's weight in gold.

Miss Harrington brought her pet to the London Mayor Hotel for the weighing-in ceremony and Michael tipped the scales at 84.6 pounds, four ounces. With the value of gold set at 12 1/2 lb an ounce, his worth should have been £1,650.
