

# NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

(Special Despatch to Examiner.)

LONDON, May 22.

The Turks have defeated certain insurgents in several encounters.

The British Consul at Cavca has proposed an armistice.

There is no truth in the report that the Russian military authorities have forbidden the Bessarabian deputies in the Roumanian Parliament to attend any more sittings of that Assembly.

Though Austria refused to permit Montenegro to acquire Antivari, lest it become virtually a Russian port, she does not object to the acquisition of Spissia, which will give the Montenegrins access to the sea.

The Austrian precautions in Transylvania are being hastened.

The Vienna correspondent of the Daily Telegraph says the relations between Austria and Roumania have become closer. He also says the Emperor William advised Prince Charles to yield Bessarabia, and abdicate if the Roumanians raised difficulties, but the Prince refused and went to the army. This German interference has given offence at Vienna.

The Times, in an editorial on Sir John Holker's reply to Mr. Gourby in the House of Commons, expresses the utmost confidence that England has nothing to fear from Alabamas or Fenians.

Her Majesty's steamship "Triumph" armoured, 6,660 tons burthen, and carrying 14 guns, has started for the Pacific to relieve the "Shah," 6,040 tons and 26 guns, as flagship.

BELGRADE, May 22.

The Ministerial crisis is ended. A compromise was made by referring the question of the legality of the sentence passed on civilians by a military commission to the Court of Appeals. The Ministers have withdrawn their resignations.

## Local and Other Items.

THE McCarthy mystery deepens.

NO PAPER TO-MORROW.—Queen's B. today.

THE storm signal was hoisted this morning at 10 o'clock.

THE steamers M. A. Starr and Miramichi sailed from this port last night.

PROFESSORS DUNLOP & PERKINS, magicians, exhibited in Market Hall, last evening, to a very small audience.

PERSONAL.—Mr. Bell, of Montreal, the popular representative of A. R. Bell, Wine Merchant, is in town.

SCHOONER Katie, Walsh, master, arrived at Quebec to-day, the 23rd inst., from Barbadoes, via Charlottetown, bound for Montreal.

THE only case before the Stipendiary Magistrate this morning was that of Ellen Fortisue, who was arrested by officer McGonnel for wandering in the streets at an unreasonable hour last night. She was discharged.

AT a meeting of the Licensing Board, held this evening, at 4 o'clock, all members present, the application of Mr. John Gahan, for store license, was granted, and the application of Mr. Donald McIsaac, for a saloon license, was declined. There being no other business, the meeting adjourned.

TO DAY'S rain will have good effect on the Victoria Park for cricket, as it will harden the ground. Even though it rains all night, one-hour's sun to-morrow will dry it. Good sport may be expected. Natives, don't be beaten.

THE brig, Hildred, Richards, owned by Peake Bros. & Co., with a cargo consisting of 16,800 bushels of oats (of 36 lbs. each), and 1,750 pieces deals and ends, containing 48,000 feet sup. measure, cleared for Queenstown for orders on the 23rd inst.

THE Gazette of the 16th inst. has the following appointment: Horace Haszard, Gentleman, to be Measurer and Surveyor of Shipping for the County of Queen's, in the Province of Prince Edward Island, under the provisions of the Imperial Colonial Shipping Act of 1868, the 11th Section of the Canadian Act 36 Vic., Chap. 128, and the 7th Section of the Act 36 Vic., Chap. 129, respecting the shipping of seamen, vice Mr. John Haszard, deceased.

THE steamer Corroll, Wright, master, sailed for Boston this afternoon with a freight of 300 boxes of eggs and sundry goods and produce. The following ladies and gentlemen went as passengers: Mrs. R. DEPUTY Sheriff Sweeney, of Moncton, arrived on the Island yesterday, to secure Wm. Cumming, an important evidence in the McCarthy inquest. He obtained the assistance of Sergeant McGregor, of the City Police, and proceeded to Suffolk—ten miles from this city—last night, and arrested the witness. Cummings is now at the Police Station, and will be taken to Shediac to-morrow. The Deputy Sheriff has also authority to arrest another witness named Carruthers, who is, at present, in Kensington.

MR. J. NEWSON is now engaged in placing the new lock-boxes in the Post Office. They will be arranged over the old lock-boxes, and substitute the glass ones. Each box will be fitted with a very handsome Yale Post Office Lock, which is made of brass, in the form of a very neat door, of six-by-three inch dimensions. In the lower part is inserted a piece of glass—which is protected by a moulding—so that the owner can see whether there is anything in the box without opening it. Besides being a convenience to the public, the new boxes will add greatly to the appearance of the Post Office.

THE RACING at Upton Park to-morrow has all prospects of being very lively. The track has been graded in such a manner that rain can have but little effect; and, we are informed,

that after the heaviest rain an hour's sunshine is sufficient to make it fit for trotting purposes. Three first-class races are on the programme: The first—\$100 a side—will be contested by Mr. A. N. Large's b. m. "Fairy" and Mr. R. FitzSimmons' b. m. "Princess." (It is expected that the time made in this race will be the fastest ever made on the Island.) The second will be contested by Mr. G. Muttart's gr. g. "Deceiver," Mr. R. Steele's b. m. "Lady May," and Mr. C. Westcott's b. g. "Honest Harry." The third will be for green horses. The entries for this race will be made on the ground. Many horses, including three from Summerside, are expected to take part in it. Besides the races above stated there will be running races.

MORE ABOUT THE MCCARTHY MURDER.—The finding of the stone in the Scadouc has re-directed attention to the rumored discovery of a grave in the clay or sand at low water mark near where the body of McCarthy was put in. Search will be made to test the truth of the report. It has been learned that McFarland, who was thought to be the midnight visitor at the Osbornes bar on the 12th October, was not in Shediac at that date, though he was there on the 21st, when he was seen at the Adams House. The Riley girls will corroborate this statement. An important witness has just been discovered in Moncton, whose testimony it is said will corroborate some evidence already given. The stone found in the Scadouc has evidently been used as part of a chimney or fire place. It is half-dressed and one surface is discolored by soot and smoke. Our report says that a fibre of rope was adhering to the stone when it was raked up.

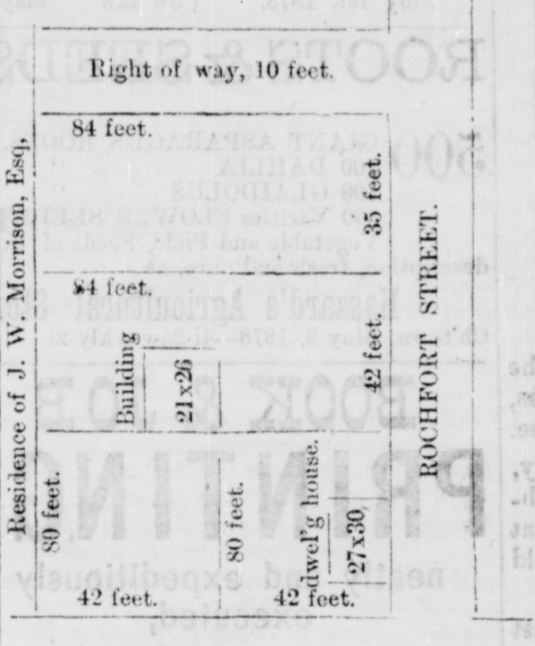

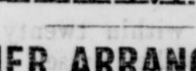
