## Magistrate's Court At Georgetown

Stipendiary Magistrate for King's County, Joseph W. MacDonald, Q. C., held Court in the Court House in Georgetown on Wednesday, August 6th, at 2:00 p. m.

The first case heard involved a resident of Murray River who pleaded guilty to creating a disturbance and was fined \$6 and costs or one month in jail. A resident of Montague pleaded guilty to an offence under the Temperance Act and was fined \$20 and costs or thirty days.

A resident of St. Theresa both pleaded guilty to charges under the Temperance Act, and was each fined \$20 and costs or 30 days and a St. Mary's Road resident pleaded guilty to a charge under the Highway Traffic Act and was fined \$10 and costs or ten days in jail.
