State Funeral For Former Prime Minister King

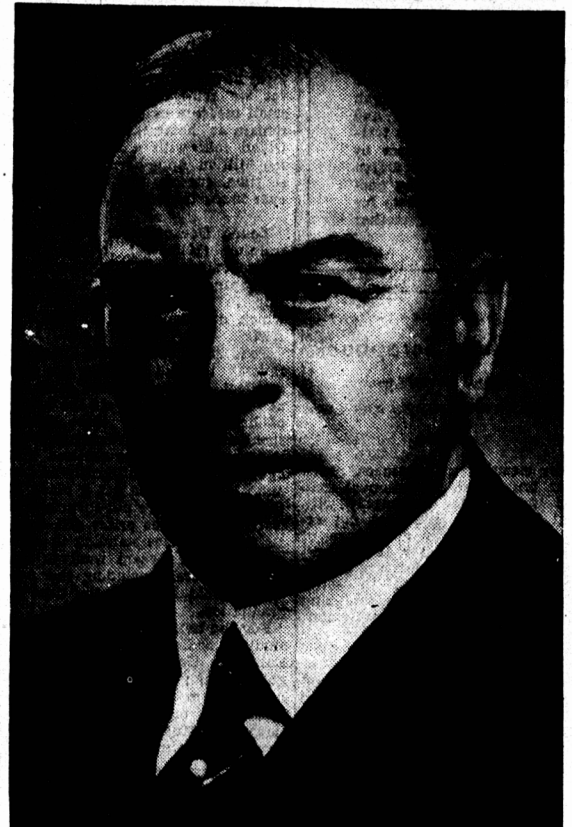
Played Leading Part In Public Affairs For Half A Century

OTTAWA, July 23 (CP)—Rt. Hon. William Lyon Mackenzie King, Canada's bachelor statesman and former Prime Minister, died peacefully at his summer home near here last night. He was 75.

Death came at 9:42 p. m. EDT, after he had been unconscious nearly 48 hours following an acute attack of pneumonia, suffered late Thursday afternoon.
