Nissan Motor Co. Plans To Push Sales In Canada

Nissan Motor Company Canada Limited, incorporated in Canada, will be inaugurated by the end of this year or early next year, with a paid capital of \$500,000 (U.S.), fully financed by Nissan Motor.

The project has been approved by the governments of Japan and Canada, Nissan said. Nissan car exports to Canada started in 1959 and have risen to 250 in the latter half of this year.

Nissan is expecting to export 3,000 cars to Canada next year. This is the third sales company to be set up overseas by Nissan motor. The others are in the United States and Mexico.

Nissan said its exports to the United States are now 1,300 a month. It is planning to construct two 16,000-ton carriers to transport its cars and trucks in a shuttle service between Japan and north and central America by the end of 1965.


