A KNOCK DOWN BLOW.

The Guardian argues that the proposed tunnel will not result in higher prices for potatoes, oats and other of our farmers' commodities,—that means of continuous communication with outside markets, enabling them to take advantage of the highest prices, will not benefit the farmers of this Province. If its contention be right, the Guardian has given the tunnel scheme a knock down blow.

But the Guardian maintains, in the same breath, that land-owners will benefit immensely as a result of the construction of the tunnel. In this view, it is comforting to know that most of our farmers own the land that they till, and that if they do not receive benefit from the tunnel as farmers, they will as landowners.

To ordinary common-sense honest men the correctness of this conclusion must be clear. But it is not wonderful that political economists who ignore idleness, unthrift, drunkenness, delinquency and gambling as factors in the production of poverty and contend that poverty can be abolished by taxing the "unearned increment in land," cannot see it.
