7. I am disappointed with the Student Union's approach to stamping out APATHY on this campus. It is essential to ask students personally to get involved rather than soliciting their participation by pinning up posters on bulletin boards.
8. I think the government should lower the legal age of the province to 18.
9. I don't think the P.E.I. government should support total union of the maritime provinces.
10. The government should allow a liquor license on campus, permanently.
11. The province should have an ombudsman to protect individual rights.
