

Bad News From Chili.

A DESPERATE BATTLE—VESSELS SEIZED—THE MISERY APPALLING. Despatches from Chili state that a desperate battle has been fought at Copiapo, the capital of the province of Atacama, resulting in a victory for the insurgents.

It is stated that the insurgents, in order to supply their fleet with coal, have seized the colliers Rogar and Killmore. The former is a German vessel, and the latter flies the British flag. This transaction, it is said, took place at Quivan, and the British gunboat Warspite is now hunting the insurgents.

The Comercia de Antofagasta reports that the hills near Pisagua are covered with dead bodies. It fails to say whether the dead are insurgents or adherents of Palmseda.

At Iquique vagabonds are robbing, plundering, murdering, violating women and committing all classes of atrocities, while incendiaries also are at work. The distress along the south coast, due to the revolution, is appalling. General Cerros, who commands Iquique, has been selling flour at 22 cents per pound.

Hundreds of men have abandoned the nitrate works and only carrying bottles of water and accompanied by their family, have trudged across the deserts. The scene hardly finds an equal in the history of war and revolt.

The rebel forces which fought around Pocolonimo and near Iquique last month numbered 4,000 men, while the government troops reach barely 3,000. The dead in the different actions numbered 930 and include many high officials. The rebels finally won and captured 39 cannons and getting Guillermo Matta, Chilean minister in the Argentine Republic, and Senor Antezar, Chilean minister in France, have been declared traitors by President Balmaceda. Antezar placed government funerals at the disposal of the rebels.
