**CHEESE CORNMEAL FINGERS**  
Mix and sift into bowl, 1 1/4 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 1 1/4 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 3 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. salt. Cut in finely 3 lbs. chilled shortening and mix in 1/2 c. yellow cornmeal, 1/2 c. shredded cheese and 2 lbs. chopped parsley. Make a well in centre, pour in 1/2 c. milk and mix lightly with a fork. Knead for 10 seconds on a lightly-floured board and roll out to 3/4" thick rectangle; cut into 12 fingers and arrange, slightly apart, on greased baking sheet. Bake in hot oven, 425°, about 15 mins. Serve hot with butter or margarine. Yield—1 dozen fingers.

that is, the boys did; the girls never got a chance at such subjects. Instead they were packed off Saturday afternoon to a sewing school. But every day all the pupils recited verses from the Scriptures and sometimes they studied the Catechism.
