

**Manufacturers  
Disapprove  
Tax Decision**

TORONTO (CP) — The president of the Canadian Manufacturers Association have expressed disapproval of Finance Minister Gordon's decision to retain the 11-per-cent sales tax on production machinery, although implementing it in stages between now and Jan. 1, 1965.

H. Roy Crabtree of Montreal said in a statement released here that the association welcomes the decision to eliminate the tax on materials consumed in the manufacturing process "which would have been an unduly heavy burden for manufacturers to bear."

But he described the decision to apply the sales tax on production machinery in stages as "temporary and partial relief which will help in adjusting to the new tax."

His statement added: "But at the end of 18 months we will be almost as badly off as we were when Mr. Gordon brought down his budget June 13."
