Corner Brook Hospital Is Overcrowded

CORNER BROOK (CP)—Western Memorial Hospital here is "dangerously" overcrowded and understaffed, the hospital board of governors was told Wednesday.

Matron Geraldine Fitzgerald said the staff shortage will become worse with the resignation of more nurses in the next 30 days.

Twenty-five graduate nurses were caring for 98 patients in the 75-bed hospital Wednesday, the board learned. To provide 24-hour care many nurses had to work 60 hours or more a week. Some days the hospital had 119 patients.

"We've got to get more nurses," said Dr. T. T. Moohan of the medical staff. "The situation is now getting dangerous. I hesitate to suggest what things could happen if we continue with such a small nursing staff."

He urged building a new nurses' residence.
