Contract Bridge

 AN EXPERT SLIPS
 West was an expert in the following deal, but he nevertheless made a faulty analysis.

North dealer. Both sides vulnerable.

The bidding:
 North East South West
 1♠ 1♥ 1♠ Pass
 2♠ Pass 3♥ Pass
 3♠ Pass 4♥ Pass
 4♥ Pass 5♥ Pass

It would seem that South bid strongly enough without finally going to five spades.
 West opened the heart deuce; East cashed the king and played the heart ace. South ruffed, led a spade to the ace and a spade back to the king, and saw that he would have to lose a trump trick.
 Obviously, the contract was now in great jeopardy, since a diamond loser was also inevitable if the defenders played correctly. South, however, gave them the chance to go wrong! Leaving the high spade queen in West's hand, temporarily, South cashed the king, queen and ace of clubs—then threw West in with the trump.
 West, an expert, made a rapid count of South's distribution and concluded that he had started with exactly five spades, one heart, and three clubs, hence that he must hold four diamonds. That being so, a heart return by West, permitting a ruff and discard, would do South no good. So, rather than lead from the diamond queen into the possible ace-duck in the closed hand, West exited with a heart. This was a fatal decision. South got rid of his losing diamond while he ruffed in dummy.
 West's analysis did not include one vital point! If East had held four clubs, he certainly should have discarded his last club when West was thrown in with a trump. In the absence of that discard, West definitely should have counted South for the thirteenth club, and returned a diamond as the only hope for setting the contract.
