Sod-Turning Ceremony Carried Out At S'side

"Your project is the type we would like to see all over the Island in 1964", Dr. Frank MacKinnon, Charlottetown, president of the Fathers of Confederation Memorial Foundation Charities Committee said at 11:00 a.m. sod-turning ceremony here yesterday.

In referring to the fountain he said it will be a beautiful piece of work. You are setting an excellent precedent. I am sure the Fathers of Confederation would be pleased with the memorial.

W.A. Currie, chairman of the Summerisde centennial committee, said "this marks one special event in the history of our town."

Mr. Currie, who presided at the ceremony, said "we also feel this site is particularly appropriate, adjoining memorial park." He recalled those who went to fight and "made it possible that we in Canada are able to celebrate our centennial as free people."

Both Mr. Currie and Mayor J.E. Morrison, who turned the first sod, congratulated Ted Gohurt of M.F. Schurman's Ltd. who designed this project which will be known as "Summerisde Centennial Fountain".

"It will not be until the year 1967", Mayor Morrison said "when we will have the opportunity to see and appreciate the full significance of this memorial, but I know what that time arrives that not only our town's people but all who visit our town will say that Summerisde is a truly reclaimed and exemplified the spirit of confederation first broached in Charlottetown in 1884."

In congratulating the people of Summerisde and the committees involved in the project, Col. W.E. Johnston, Northern special projects committee chairman, said "I am sure Summerisde will be proud of this project when it is completed."

Mishandling Of Funds By Gov't Employee Denied

A categorical denial that there was any mishandling of government funds by an employee of the provincial government was made yesterday by Premier Walter R. Shaw who termed the reports "inaccurate street rumour."

One report said the sum involved was \$12,000, but the Premier said there was no loss of money.

Again referring to published reports Premier Shaw said "it was entirely inaccurate to say there was a suspension of an official from the treasury department or that the resignation of a department official was in the hands of the government. There has been no suspension of a treasury employee nor has any member of the department submitted his resignation."

The Evening Patriot yesterday said "strong reports of possible mishandling of public funds by an employee of the provincial government were rampant in the city today."

It added: "It is believed the government is considering hiring, or already has hired, an outside firm of auditors to come here and check various accounts. It is also believed the 'trouble' was discovered by authorities last week and suspension of an official of the government today.

Proposals whereby the Summerisde Lobster Carnival hopes to make a profit of not less than \$5,000 in the coming year were presented by the new president, Francis MacQuarrie at a meeting of the legion here last night.

The new president discussed the carnival's financial report of last year and made suggestions on matters which would be financial improvements that can be made in 1964.

The new executive said they hope to make more money in this year's carnival on lobster suppers, the coronation ball and the cañon in the stadium.

ERWER TICKETS Mr. MacQuarrie suggested that advertising and travelling expenses be lowered and fewer complimentary tickets for entrance to the stadium be given.

The cost of parking attendants was considered too high by those at the meeting. An organization may be asked to supervise the parking program.

A letter was read to the meeting by Miss P.E.I. 1963, Cheryl Paquette, expressing her thanks for being sent to the Miss Canada contest in Toronto this autumn. She said it was "by far the most wonderful experience of my life."
