The Mother Country and the Colonies.

A COMMERCIAL UNION PROPOSED BY THE LORD MAYOR OF LONDON.

One the evening of the 16th inst., the Lord Mayor of London gave a banquet at the Mansion House to representatives of the British Colonies, all of the colonies and most of the dependencies being represented.

"Though the Poet Laureate's dreams at confederation of the nations and the parliament of man might never take place, there was one thing within the sphere of practical politics, namely, when foreign countries were making hostile tariffs, the colonies and the Mother Country could make a tariff of mutual benefit to each other."

The Earl of Kimberley replied to this toast, and urged the necessity of unity between all parts of the empire. He said that the people of the colonies were all one people, and Canadians and Australians and others all looked to England as their home.

Letters in England from America announce that Messrs. Moody and Sankey will commence an "evangelizing mission" in Scotland early next October.
