**\$500 Fine Levied At Souris For Illicit Spirits Possession**

**SOURIS** — Kenneth James Carter, Souris, was fined \$500 and costs or six months in Kings County jail when he appeared in magistrate's court here yesterday on a charge of having possession of illicit spirits. Magistrate James B. Johnston, Q.C., presided, while Deputy Attorney-General J. Arthur McGuigan conducted the case for the Crown.

The case of Albert Stanley Perry, Souris, charged with possession of a still suitable for the manufacture of illicit spirits, was adjourned until Oct. 31 so that the accused may obtain counsel. A sentence of one month in
