NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market pushed its recovery movement into the second day Thursday.

The news that gave the market a strong prod was the action of the First National Bank of Boston in rescinding its increase of the prime rate.

President Johnson Wednesday had appealed to banks to keep the scattered boost in the prime rate from spreading.

The Associated Press said 60 stocks rose 1.3 to 334.4. The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials added 3.63 at 570.39.

Stocks led much of their early strength, Jones and Laughlin, advanced by a point at one stage, closed unchanged. U.S. Steel and Bethlehem held onto fractional gains.

Among Canadian issues traded Canadian Pacific gained a point, International Nickel 1/4. Dome Mines dropped 1/8. Hudson Bay Mining and Walker Goddard each 1/8, McIntyre Petroleum 1/8.

Prices on the American Stock Exchange were mixed. Volume was 1,400,000 shares, contrary with 1,300,000. O'Leary's Scurry Railway O'Leary's Canadian Marconi 1/8. Festus 1-1/8. Brantford traction 1/4.
