

Eden Would Demilitarize Zone Without Backing Up

GENEVA (AP)—A senior diplomat says Britain's plan for a demilitarized area in Europe is intended mainly to disarm East Germany.

Russia insists that the demilitarized area should extend beyond Germany, the informant said Friday. Britain then will ask for parts of East Europe—such as Poland and Czechoslovakia—be included.

The British project rests on a Western decision that there must be no shrinkage of the NATO area if the Russians in future Big Four negotiations accept the idea of demilitarization. This decision was endorsed in Paris last week by the foreign ministers' council of the 15-nation Atlantic pact.

The Big Four agreed Wednesday to examine Prime Minister Eden's demilitarization idea along with other proposals designed to reinforce East-West security in the sensitive parts of central Europe. It is included in the directive which the Big Four hope to formulate for the further study of their foreign ministers in Geneva next October.

Eden has also proposed, over and above the creation of a demilitarized zone, that force and armaments limitations be imposed in a transcontinental strip running along both sides of the Iron Curtain. The depth of this strip remains a matter of negotiation. In a joint East-West team of inspectors would be empowered to range freely to see that the limitations are observed.

The British leader envisaged, the informant said, that all troops should be withdrawn from the demilitarized zone. Arms factories would be barred. Air bases and guided missile ranges would have to be pulled back. In practice, these restrictions would apply to the forces and installations of the Communist world. The whole project is consistent with fixed British-American policy to try to roll back the Iron Curtain by peaceful means.

To make the proposal less unattractive to the Russians, French Premier Faure suggested that the military strength of Germany—even after that country is united—should be fixed at levels now per-

mitted for West Germany. Besides a whole carefully spelled out range of armament curbs, West Germany now can raise no more than 500,000 soldiers, sailors and airmen.

Faure's proposal is known to be acceptable to West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer.

The British decision to confine demilitarization mainly to East Germany arose from fears expressed by some of the smaller Allied nations. They doubted the wisdom of Eden's demilitarization project because they felt the Russians would seize on it and seek to apply it west of the Iron Curtain.

Foreign Capital In Canada Brings Men And Machinery

MONTREAL (CP)—Foreign investment in this country has helped to give Canada a stable and premium currency, the Bank of Montreal says in its July business review.

Referring to the upsurge in direct investment from abroad, the bank says that the average annual inflow from 1950 to 1954 was \$336,000,000 compared with an average of \$67,000,000 in the years 1946 to 1949, inclusive.

"Aside from the delayed impact of income payments, the capital inflow of the past five years has generated a number of changes in the field of merchandise trade," said the review.

"On one hand, it has been accompanied by a movement into the country of machinery, equipment and skilled personnel, all of which have involved increased foreign exchange requirements.

CHANGE BALANCE

"On the other hand, as the new industrial facilities have reached the production stage, they have in some cases, such as petroleum, reduced Canada's dependence on imports, and in others, such as mining and pulp and paper, increased the volume of exports."

Noting the increase in purchase volume of Canadian stocks by non-residents, in marked contrast to

the rising repatriation of Canadian funds and debentures held abroad, the bank cites the widespread foreign interest in Canada's economic potential as a major reason for the growth in holdings of Canadian securities abroad.

Protest Can. Woodsmen Taking Jobs In States

WASHINGTON (AP)—A cessation of importing bonded Canadian laborers into northeastern states was urged Thursday before Senate labor sub-committee.

Representatives of the International Brotherhood of Pulp, Sulphite and Paper Mill Workers of New Hampshire testified the Canadians were brought in by American employers at rates below the "going scale," displacing U. S. citizens.

Samuel E. Angoff, Boston lawyer representing the union, described the process thus:

An American employer advertises for workers at the rate of his lowest paid job and below the union scale. When there are no takers the employer advises the state director of employment security he wishes to import Canadians because he can't fill his needs locally. The employment security director then certifies that a certain number of Canadians may be

imported at specified rates for specified jobs.

CAN'T ORGANIZE

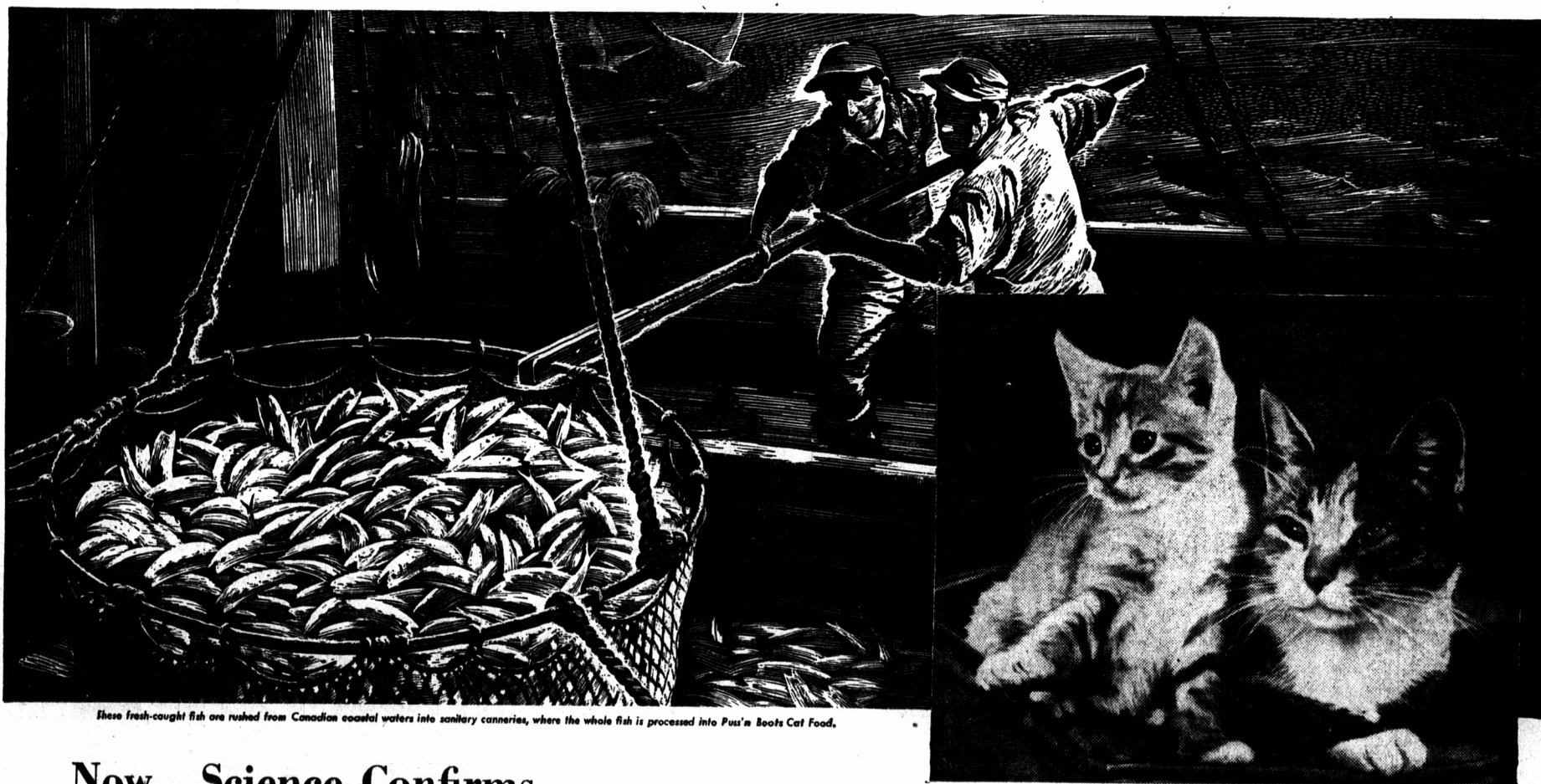
Union officials conceded the only way to force this was by labor organization. They said, however, they were blocked in their organization efforts by a national relations board ruling that the itinerant Canadian laborers were eligible to vote in representation elections.

When they did organize resident workers and call a strike, they said, the immigration service ruled that Canadians as needed, thus, in effect, breaking the strike.

They urged the sub-committee, headed by Senator Paul Douglas (Dem.-Ill.), to approve the resolution of Senator Margaret Chase Smith (Rep.-Me.) calling for a determination of all the facts looking towards solution of the confused situation.

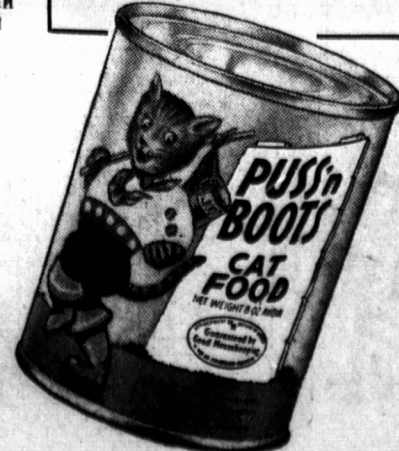
