## IN MEMORIAM

**VINCENT CONNOLLY**  
It was with deep regret the people of Bedeque and surrounding districts learned of the death of Vincent Connolly which took place in the Prince County Hospital, Summerside on Oct. 13th, 1956. Mr. Connolly was born in Charlottetown 61 years ago, moved to Bedeque with his parents, the late M. and Mrs. Patrick Connolly at an early age and has resided there since where he has made many friends who deeply mourn his passing.

He was a general favorite with old and young. By his industry and thrift he owned one of the finest farms in the district.

Mr. Connolly suffered a heart attack in January and was removed to the Charlottetown Hospital. From there he was taken to the home of his brother, Mr. Bernard Connolly where he was lovingly cared for, until he was able to return to his home in Bedeque.

In September he suffered another heart attack and was removed to the Prince County Hospital where he passed peacefully away above mentioned date. During his illness he was frequently visited by Rev. Father Doyle and Rev. Father Allen of Charlottetown, and his own Parish Priest, Rev. Reginald MacDonal.

## Anti-Russian Wave In East Germany

**BERLIN (AP)**—Communist East Germany bucked a wave of anti-Russian student unrest Friday spreading from East Berlin to Dresden.

The official Communist party organ Neues Deutschland rejected student demands for abolition of compulsory Russian instruction in universities.

Education minister Fritz Lange said, however, that "a number" of the country's newly organized high schools will drop compulsory Russian instruction and put emphasis on French and English.

## Hillary Is Busy Preparing Major Antarctic Expedition

CHRISTCHURCH, N.Z. (CP) — New Zealand is buzzing with preparations for the biggest assault ever launched on the Antarctic continent. The country has become virtually a great advance base for the southward invasion.

From late October a continual stream of aircraft and ships will push south from New Zealand. They will take men and thousands of tons of specialized equipment which has assembled in New Zealand to await the coming of the southern summer.

Most of this equipment is for the huge American "Operation Deep Freeze," but New Zealand is also pushing ahead actively with its own expedition, the first of the country has ever sent to the Ross Dependency, a sector of the Antarctic over which New Zealand claims sovereign rights.

AMERICAN VENTURE  
Last year the Americans set up two bases—one at Little America and the other at McMurdo Sound. These have been named during the Antarctic winter. Now they are to be greatly reinforced and enlarged, and five more bases are to be established, including one at the South Pole itself. All except the staging base at McMurdo Sound are being set up for scientific research in International Geophysical Year.

For months past the Americans have been assembling equipment in New Zealand ready for the southward assault. A purchasing unit has been set up and plans to spend more than \$1,000,000 in supplies in the next few months.

A communications unit has established a teleprinter network which will eventually link the South Pole, Antarctic bases, New Zealand and Honolulu. A camp has been built for a maintenance unit which will service aircraft in between flights to the Antarctic.

Most of the activities centre on Christchurch, in the South Island. At airfields near the city there has been assembled the largest collection of big long-range aircraft ever seen in New Zealand. Eventually the Americans plan to have 38 planes flying in the Antarctic this season, but not all of them will be able to fly there direct. Some will be taken as cargo by larger aircraft and some will be transported in ships.

At the same time a fleet of ice breakers, transports, fuel carriers and other vessels will make New Zealand ports the taking off point in transporting heavier supplies. Meanwhile preparations for the New Zealand expedition are being under the leadership of Sir Edmund Hillary, the New Zealander pushed ahead with great vigor who climbed Everest. The New Zealand party will also make observations for International Geophysical Year and will have the additional task of providing support for the British attempt to make the first land crossing of the Antarctic. The New Zealanders will climb Everest. The British after they pass the Pole from the other side of the continent, will establish fuel and supply depots inland toward the pole for the use of the British party on the latter part of its journey.

## Recommend Five New TV And Six Radio Stations In Canada

OTTAWA (CP) — The licensing by the government of five new TV stations and six new radio stations was recommended Monday by the CBC board of governors.

The new television outlets would go into operation at Kamloops, B.C.; Medicine hat, Alta.; Rouyn, Que.; Quebec City and Antigonish, Nfld.

The new radio outlets would be in Quesnel, B. C.; Lloydminster, Alta.; Altona, Man.; Oshawa, Ont.; Richmond Hill, Ont.; and Toronto.

The recommendations are not binding on the government but they are rarely over-ruled. **SATELLITE OUTLET**  
The Argentina station would be a satellite outlet for station CJOH-TV, St. John's, Nfld., picking up the St. John's signal and re-broadcasting it to give improved coverage to Argentina, Placencia and Red Island Harbor and surrounding coastal area. It would be on channel 10 with a power of 100 watts video and 97 watts audio.

The Quebec City station, on channel 5 with power of 5.6 kilowatts video and 2.8 kilowatts audio will be operated by Television de Quebec Canada, Inc., which now operates CFQM-TV, in Quebec City. The new station, broadcasting only in English, will use joint facilities with the French-language CFQM-TV outlet.

The board said it believes an English station in Quebec City will be a marginal operation. It rejected the application of Goodwill Broadcasters of Quebec Inc., operators of English radio station CJCQ, which also applied for the licence.

## No Date Set For N.S. Gov't. Change

HALIFAX (CP)—The date Nova Scotia's new Progressive Conservative government will take over from the defeated Liberals won't likely be known before next Tuesday, outgoing Premier Henry Hicks indicated Thursday.

He has called a meeting of his election-battered cabinet for that day to discuss details of the turnover to Premier - Elect Robert Stanfield and a Conservative government still in the planning stage.

## Icebreaker Arrives At Port Churchill

CHURCHILL, Man. (CP) — The D'Iberville, Canada's newest icebreaker, docked Thursday at this Hudson Bay port, 610 miles north of Winnipeg, without tug-boat assistance under the guidance of Capt. Caron.

In place of the navigation buoys which had been lifted from the channel due to ice danger, the D'Iberville was guided on her course up river by port warden Capt. James Rose of Halifax. In the icebreaker's helicopter, piloted by W. Glennie of Ottawa.

A small group of spectators gathered at the dock to watch the D'Iberville make her first visit to Churchill. The icebreaker will load fuel and water before resuming her Arctic supply and escort duties.
