Cabot - Cartier Controversy Recalled By Re-Discovered Harris Painting



Did the Cabots really discover Prince Edward Island or was Jacques Cartier the first white man to set foot on the rich, red soil of Canada's Confederation province? No historian has proved the identity of the real discoverer beyond question of doubt. Recently a painting was found in an old store-room in the Provincial Building in Charlottetown which excited a bit of interest. It was obviously an historic painting but was rather dim in outline and had to be sent out for a careful cleaning in order to establish its identity. When the painting (above) came back to the Provincial Building, it was easily identified as the work of the famous Prince Edward Island artist, Robert Harris, C.M.G., R.C.A., and turned out to be a painting of "Cabot Landing in Prince Edward Island."

Premier J. Walter Jones viewed the painting with interest and had it placed in an honored spot on a wall in the Confederation Chamber.

According to history, the Cabots, either singly or together, sighted an island on June 21, 1497 which they called Island of St. John. This name was definitely given to Prince Edward Island later and was

the name by which it was known until 1799 when it was changed to Prince Edward in honor of the Duke of Kent, then chief of the British forces in North America.

Tradition held for many years that the Island discovered by the Cabots was Prince Edward Island. However, later historians claimed that the Island sighted by the Cabots could not have been Prince Edward Island and that Jacques Cartier, who made a landfall on the Island in 1534, was the true discoverer.

When Mr. Harris painted the picture, about 1872, it was commonly believed that John and Sebastian Cabot in the ship "Matthew" were the first to land on Prince Edward Island.

Accordingly Mr. Harris painted his version of the Cabots landing on the Island. The painting found its way into the Provincial Building and has been there ever since. Apparently it had been stored away and forgotten for years until found recently to bring to light once again the old controversy as to the identity of the real discoverer of Prince Edward Island.
