## Granted Stay Of Execution

**HAMILTON (CP)**—John Willis, now in the death cell at Hamilton jail, has been granted a stay of execution until April 21. Willis, the 35-year-old father of three children, was convicted of the hammer-slaying of his wife, and sentenced to hang April 1. It was learned Monday that Mr. Justice Rene Denis, who pronounced the death sentence in the Supreme Court here on Jan. 16, had reviewed Willis for 20 days. Willis was convicted of murdering his 33-year-old wife at their apartment in December, 1957. The jury did not add a recommendation of mercy. Subsequently, some 400 former work mates of Willis at the Otis Elevator Company Limited, signed a petition asking that the death sentence be commuted to life imprisonment.

Grant Howell, Willis' defence counsel, said he understood that, due to the forthcoming federal election, it would not be possible for the cabinet to follow its normal procedure and review the case. Willis was originally sentenced to die the day after election day. The lawyer said that after the election, the cabinet would examine the case "sometime before April 21" . . . to decide whether or not a commutation should be granted.
