Questions Re Trans-Canada

Answers to the following questions were tabled in the Legislature on Friday:

Mr. R. R. Bell:

1. Is the Leader of the Government still in charge of the Provincial arrangements for the Trans-Canada Highway?
2. Has the complete route been decided on?
3. How many miles of said highway will be allotted or traverse Prince, Queens and King's Counties respectively?
4. Will said highway pass through the villages of Clyde River and New Haven in Queen's County?
5. Is it the intention of the Leader of the Government to announce the complete course of the highway before the forthcoming Provincial election from Bonshaw to Charlottetown?
6. Will the West River Bridge as promised to be built in the Government platforms of 1943 and 1947 be part of the Trans-Canada Highway?
7. Will work be commenced on this Bridge in 1951?

Answers tabled by Premier Jones:

1. Yes.
2. In general, yes. In sections where existing roads do not meet standard requirements, surveys are still being made to determine the most practical route.
3. The total of approximately 74 miles is distributed as follows: Prince County - 11 miles; Queens County - 63 miles.
4. The section from Cornwall to Bonshaw does not meet standard requirements. An alternative route is being sought at the present time. Until surveys are complete, it is not known whether the whole section will have to be abandoned or not.
5. The route can only be announced after all details have been worked out and approved by the Government of Canada. It is not possible to say how soon this will be completed.
6. The West River Bridge can be a part of Trans Canada Highway if the highway should cross West River. This has yet to be determined.

OTTAWA, March 17 (CP)—Margarine production last year topped the 1949 figure by 20,074,000 pounds, the Bureau of Statistics reported today.

Production last year totalled 94,032,000 pounds, 27 per cent above the 1949 figure of 73,958,000.

Output of shortening and lard also increased, but to a lesser degree. Shortening in 1950 totalled 128,538,000 pounds, an increase of nine per cent over the 115,911,000
