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POPE LEO'S GREAT WORK.

Nothing Less Momentous Than the Reconciliation of the Greek and Roman Churches.

Very remarkable is the progress which has been made during the last twelve months in the great work upon the reconciliation of the Greek and Roman Churches.

It is no longer any secret at Rome that the recent interviews of the Czar's brothers with the Pope have had a bearing on the subject, and one of the most influential prelates of the Pontiff's Curia, Cardinal Vanutelli, published a pamphlet on the subject.

The work in question is asserted to have been received with tokens of marked favor by the Muscovite court, as well as by the Emperor, the president of the Holy Synod at St. Petersburg, the Czar's former tutor and present confidant, and his adviser, N. Polidorevitch.

At Athens the government press is openly discussing the question of reconciliation with expressions of joy, and at Bucharest, Tolin, and in Constantinople the same favorable dispositions are to be found on the part of the government.

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LIFE IN NEW ZEALAND.

One Continued Round of Holidays, Picnics, of Course, Most Favored.

The colonists of New Zealand area holiday-making people. There is almost an average of one recognized holiday to the month, and it is common practice for all working people to take two or more days at Christmas, New Year and Easter, so as to make an unbroken pleasure of three or four days, including Sunday.

The commonest of all holiday amusements, however, is a picnic. The several trades sects and societies have picnics of their own, and the public are cordially welcome on the payment of a small sum toward the expense of the entertainment. It is amusing to the casual way traveler to note, as he passes through some pleasant countryside, not one or two, but perhaps fifty different picnics in full swing, each numbering scores or hundreds of guests. It has been said with much more truth than is usually to be found in epigrams of this kind, that:

"In New Zealand people are like cattle. You need only turn a number of heads in the same direction, and they will be perfectly happy."

On a warm and tempering New Year's Day an enterprising tourist might walk through the streets of the city and find himself, undisturbed, to the contents of most of the houses. Dwellings and streets appear alike deserted, and the casual sojourner who does not understand the way of the place sees in vain for some one to speak to. By 6 or 7 o'clock in the evening the streets are filled with returning crowds.

THE TELEGRAPH IN AFRICA.

How it is Proposed to Carry the Line Across the Continent.

The business partner of one of the directors of the company formed to build a telegraph line from the Cape to Cairo has given a Pall Mall Gazette reporter some interesting information.

The materials are now being ordered in London and will be shipped shortly. The poles are to be of iron of light construction, in order to obviate the expense of carrying them across the desert.

There will be nothing in the way of avoiding the low country and keeping to the high plateau the entire distance. There are two alternative routes for the telegraph line, and the one chosen will be that which offers the least difficulty.

Care of the Bathrooms.
