Entry fee is \$3.00 and games are singles and must be single knockout.

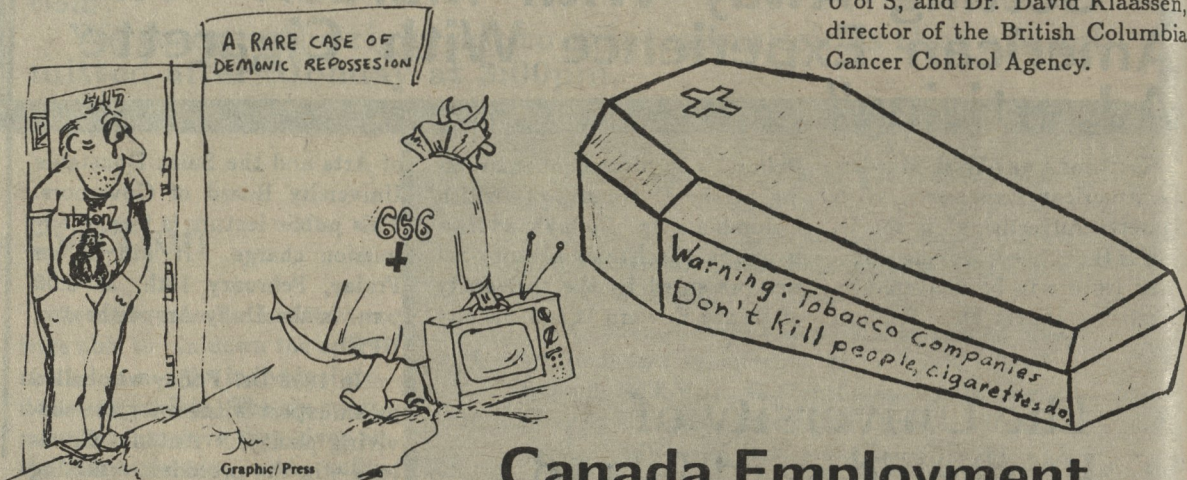
