LETTERS FROM SOUTH AFRICA.

(Continued from page 5.)

Writing to his parents from Orange River Camp, Mr. A. J. B. Mellish says: ORANGE RIVER CAMP, South Africa, Dec. 19, '99.

... The right half battalion went on this morning, but we do not think we can get a train until tomorrow morning. We expect to be in time for the battle. Last night I was on picket a short distance from camp. It was a beautiful night and nothing very remarkable happened. Our party discerned objects moving on the veldt and crept up on them. The sergeant in charge challenged them but they did not halt. We were about to fire when we discovered they were ostriches.

The Gordon Highlanders and other regiments are here. Two men were shot the other night. One of them belonged to the Shropshire regiment. There are a good many prisoners here, mostly wounded Boers. We have had task and salt canned mutton now. We sleep on ground under tent with blankets rolled around us though it is likely we will dispense with the tents farther on.

Mules are the chief beasts of burden. Six or eight of them are harnessed to a cart driven by Kaffirs. Our men are busy building a railway siding today. A bridge was blown up by the Boers the other day, which prevented our onward journey.

After leaving here all our letters will be read, and we will be limited to a certain number.

It is very hot and sandy here—very few trees.

Our password last night was "Chamberlain," after the Hon. Joseph Chamberlain.

Some of the wounded soldiers were showing me things they had taken from dead Boers, etc. One man is said to have got a belt of diamonds and it was quite a common thing for men to come back from a charge riding a Boer's pony.

Have not had any news from Canada yet. All the Island boys are well.
