This followed a decrease in output of 6.3 per cent in January, dropping production in the first two months of the year by 8.3 per cent to 649,717 fine ounces from 655,853 a year earlier. February production figures with February 1961, January brackets included 47 Atlantic provinces 807 fine ounces (76); Quebec 73,998 (78,849).

trumps, and then plays the A-K and aces club. Unfortunately, West wins the third club and shifts to the jack of trumps. This spells disaster, because the defense wins two diamonds and a club to defeat the hand and trick count. South is unlucky in two respects. If East had had three clubs instead of two, he would have made the contract, since East could not successfully attack the hand in that case. And if West had instead of the ace of diamonds had the East, South would also have made the contract. However, South can improve his chances considerably, and in the actual case make it a hand, by adopting a slightly different line of play. What he should do is play a low spade from dummy on the opening lead. This makes the ace an odd thing to do, but it cannot cost declarer anything to do this. If he does not, he is an extra chance to make the contract. East wins the spade, but cannot defeat the contract regardless of what he returns. (As a matter of fact, if he does not, he can cash the ace of diamonds at the club trick for him, and it is a simple matter to enter dummy with a trump and discard two diamonds on the 8-7 of clubs. This will declare him to do, really, is to play the right way to play at trick one.)

One letter simply stands for another. In this sample A is used for the three X's, for the two O's, etc. Single letters, apostrophes, the length and formation of the words are all hints. Each day the code letters are different.
