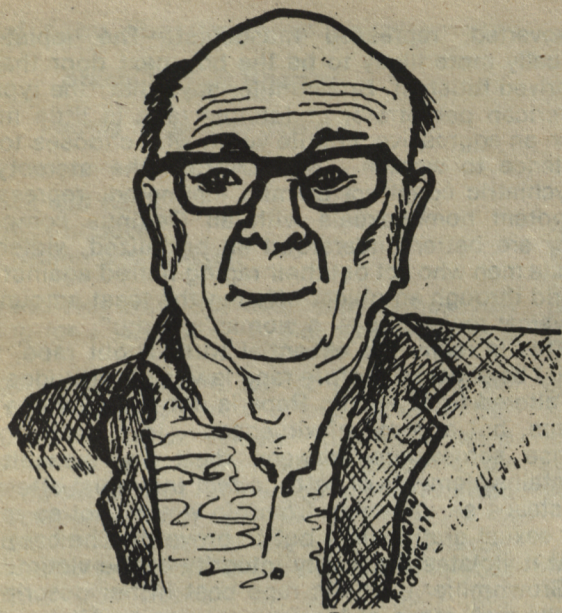


Panthers put the Paw on Dalhousie
