MONTREAL (CP) - The U.S. dollar Wednesday closed at a discount of 4 1/2 per cent in terms of Canadian funds, unchanged. Pound sterling \$2.65 13-16, down 1/4.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - The stock market rallied a few minutes before the close Wednesday to pull itself into an irregular pattern. Industrials were the main issues to improve with the fresh buying.
The industrial index gained a bit more than one-half point and western oils added more than one-quarter of a point. Base metals slipped their loss by more than one-half and closed with a decline of slightly more than one-half point.
Gold was up 1/2 point, silver only 50 shares. Led industrial winners with a four-point climb to a new high of 70. International Utilities gained 1 1/2 points at 63 1/2 and several other issues were ahead 1/2.

Trans Mountain, Toronto Dominion Bank and Union Gas each lost about 1/4 point. Moore Corp. was off a point to 68.
Consolidated Denison had the heaviest loss among mines, leading high-priced uranium lower with a 1 1/2-point loss at 18 1/2. McIntyre was off a point to 112 among senior golds. Normetal lost 35 cents at \$3.80 among lower-priced mines. Stanleigh was off 25 cents to \$4.35.
Western oils had a few smart winners. Jupiter featured, climbing 55 cents to \$2.93. Pacific Petroleum was up 1 1/2 points to 33 1/2. Canada Southern added 35 cents at \$8.15 but Trans Canada lost 30 cents at \$2.15.

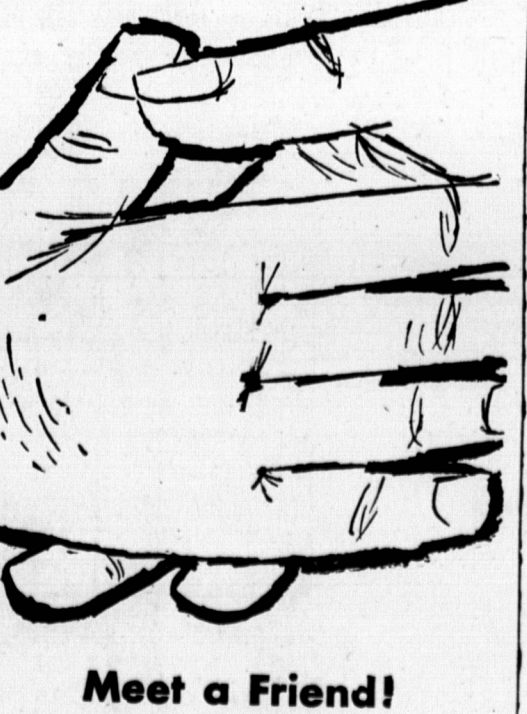

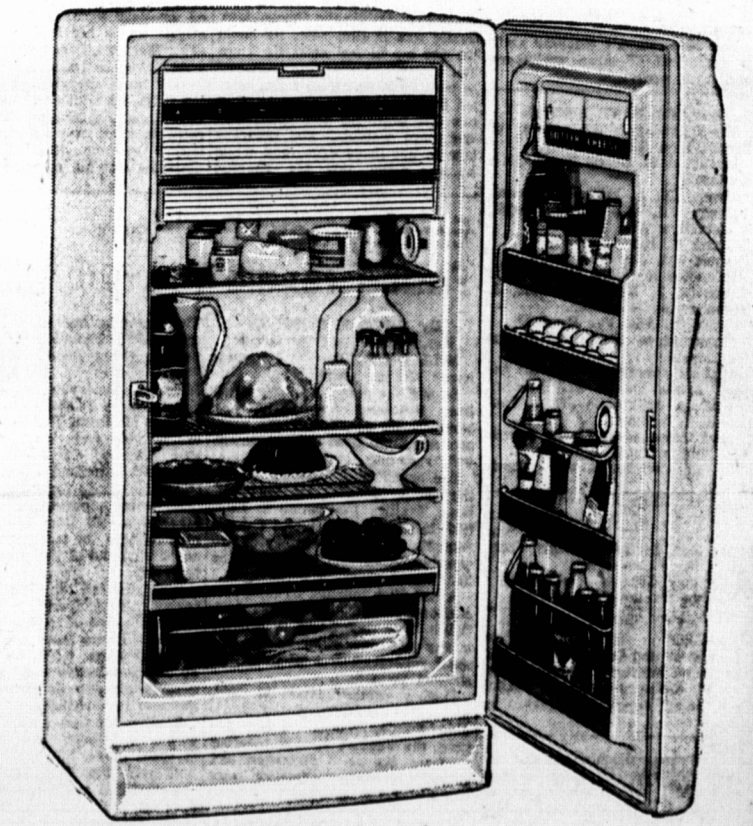
