

# Drug & Alcohol Workshop

An education series on marijuana will be held at the Alcohol and Drug Problems Institute beginning on March 3, 1983. This is a four part series, and will be held each Thursday at 8:00 pm at the Institute on Beach Grove Road.

The program is designed for young people interested in learning about marijuana, and young people experiencing problems with its use.

Speakers will consist of physicians, guidance counsellors, youth counsellors, and recovered marijuana addicts. Audio visual aids and small discussion groups will make up part of each session.

The Marijuana Information Program is one of several projects being sponsored by "Youth,

Parents, and Chemicals" which is funded by a Canada Community Service Project, and is under the supervision of the Alcohol and Drug Problems Institute.

"Youth, Parents, and Chemical" is attempting to bring to young people and adults in the community a better understanding of the problem of drug abuse in the '80's, as well as directing young people with drug problems to treatment.

A speakers bureau has been set up to community groups and organizations. Speakers are available on all aspects of prevention, intervention, and treatment. These include professionals in the field, recovered addicts, and family members involved with the problem.

I'm glad to see that the lyrics are included in the album or else I would be totally lost, as the accents are quite thick in this Jamacain flavoured disco release.

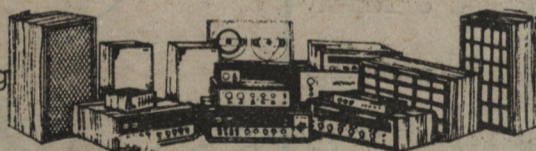
**GROUP:** Duran Duran
