Now Is Perfect Time For Garden Breakfasts

This is the time for breakfast in the garden.
Big grill small grill, barbecue grill—it doesn't matter as long as there's room for the coffee pot to bubble, for a pan to fry sausages and a saucepan to boil eggs.
Everybody helps carry out the fixings.
CAREFREE OCCASION
Spread a checked tablecloth on the grass or on the garden table. Use paper plates and cups. This is a carefree occasion, with spirits bright as the clear blue sky and nothing better to do at the moment than to lazily watch the dappling clouds.
"Cantaloupes are at the peak of perfection for a breakfast

centre of each slice.
Heat under broiler, or over hot coals turning to brown bread on all sides.
Monday dinner: Chilled pineapple juice, roast shoulder of pork, with tomatoes, pan-roast potatoes summer squash, coleslaw with radishes, lime sherbet with strawberry sauce, hot or iced coffee or tea, milk.
All measurements are level; recipes proportioned to serve 4 to six.
Roast shoulder of pork with tomatoes: Order 5 lbs. shoulder of pork the skin scored for easy carving. Place on rack in baking pan. Dust with mixture of 2 tsp. salt, ¼ tsp. pepper 1 tsp. powdered sage and 3 tsp. flour.
Place in hot oven, 425 degrees F.; roast until lightly browned, about 30 min. Reduce heat to 350 degrees F., and roast 20 min. to the pound.
When almost done place halved tomatoes, filled with sage bread stuffing, around pork roast. Cook 30 min. longer.
Remove tomatoes and meat to a platter and keep warm.
Make gravy from drippings in pan as follows: Pour off all but 3 tsp. of fat. Stir in 3 tsp. flour. Gradually add 1½ c. boiling water and 2 crushed bouillon cubes.
Cook-stir until boiling point is reached. Add 1 tsp. kitchen bouquet.
SUGGESTION OF CHEF
Wash and thin-slice 2 lbs. tender summer squash. Add ½ in. boiling water, ¼ tsp. powdered dill and 1 tsp. salt. Cover; slow-boil 20 min.
Stir in 1 tsp. each butter and grated Parmesan cheese.
