Bronze Medal

One of the most exciting and sanguine periods in the history of the great Southwest provides the background for Warner Bros. action-drama, "Thunder Over the Plains," starring Randolph Scott with Lex Barker and Phyllis Kirk in top roles. Filmed in WarnerColor, "Thunder Over the Plains" takes place in a colorful period when the post-Civil War tensions were at their peak and lawlessness was rampant.

Detective Sergeant Lund is the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Lund of this City. He is married to the former Catherine MacInyre of Cape Breton. They have six children.

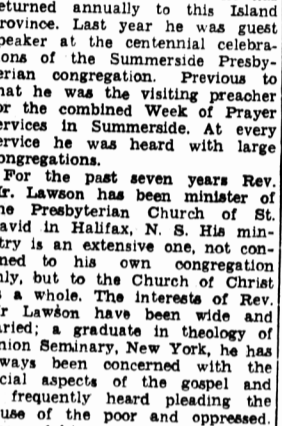
Barbecue Meal Will Be Served Opening Day S'side Raceway
